IMPACT FOR ETERNITY ON THE MOVE!

Dr. Gary Fleetwood



In January and February of this year, Dr. Eddie Ildefonso and I had the privilege of being invited to speak at two pastor's conferences. One was in the city of Tagbilarian in the Philippines, and the other was in city of Jayapura in Indonesia. During that trip we flew over 30,000 miles, were in flight for 72 hours, spent 30 hours in airports, had 18 separate flight segments, 2 helicopter flights, spent 24 days in 11 cities and 6 hotels, spoke at two pastors conferences, 1 leaders conference, 1 stadium crusade (13,000 people), and 1 evangelistic crusade (1300 people). We were seen on the Indonesian national television and heard on the Indonesian national radio. We also took one trip to a mountain village where the only means of getting there was by helicopter.

In the Philippines, the normal wage is \$7 - \$8 per day, so there was an extremely high poverty rate among the pastors. The pastor who was our host is paid two chickens every month as his normal salary. They have no meaningful

infrastructure support systems such as major roads, electricity, airports, or major commerce. Approximately 30-40 pastors and their wives were in attendance for the conference and many visitors would attend in the evening sessions. The teaching seminar went from 9am-9pm each day. It was tragic that none of the pastors had ever read through the Bible, nor could they name the major doctrines of the Bible. Once we recognized what the real need was, we made an adjustment and changed the focus of what we were teaching to address their specific spiritual and pastoral needs. There was no transportation to the venue, so we had to hire a motorized "tricycle" in the mornings, and in the evenings the pastors would bring us back to the hotel on their motorcycles – often times in the rain. In the hotel we experienced earthquake tremors and the electricity going out for various lengths of time. The pastors had no accommodations and slept on the concrete floor of the open air church in which the conference was held. The weather was very hot and humid, and unfortunately there were no showers for the pastors.

In Indonesia, which has the largest per capita Muslim population in the world, the spiritual conditions were much the same as in the Philippines. Dr. Ildefonso and I both took well over 600 pages of teaching notes, but never used that material. Only 11 of the nearly 500 pastors in attendance had ever read through the Bible. The teaching was very direct and challenged the spiritual culture of the Indonesian pastors. We learned later that the teaching was greatly appreciated because one of the attributes that is greatly admired by Indonesians is someone being very direct with them. Dr. Ildefonso preached an extremely evangelistic message to 13,000 people in the soccer stadium. His message was televised on both national television and national radio. Papua, Indonesia, the most easterly island of Indonesia, is the last Christian bastion in Indonesia. Currently, the Christian population is approximately 40-50% of the population of the island, but they used to comprise nearly 80% of the total population. It is very apparent that the Islamic faith has a very aggressive approach in reclaiming Papua, Indonesia.

Much of the conference teaching confronted salvific issues and the fact that the people were trusting in the government as their god. It was very apparent that there was a very minimal understanding of salvation, what it was, and how it was actually received. Also, there appeared to be a very large leadership vacuum within the Indonesian church. While we were at the leadership conference, many of the national Christian leaders of Papua, Indonesia from all areas of Indonesian life, met to evaluate where they were spiritually and what they

needed to do to help turn the spiritual tide of their country. In that process they asked that Covington Theological Seminary make a commitment to come to Indonesia as a seminary extension and help change the spiritual direction of their nation. It was quite an honor to have been so well received. Obviously, Covington accepted the challenge, and in May of this year Dr. Ildefonso met with the Indonesian leaders to establish the parameters and schedule for the Covington extension. They have already hired full time employees to head up the renewal initiative with Covington in order to help ensure the success of the seminary extension.

Our host for the Indonesian trip was a man by the name of Lipiyus Biniluk. He is a graduate of Covington Theological Seminary and he introduced himself to us at the 2014 Covington graduation services where he received his post graduate diploma. At that time, he asked if Covington would be willing to come to Indonesia to help develop a seminary program for them, and it was through his efforts that the trip was arranged and the conference hosted. Covington rejoices in the work that God continues to do in all of the international extensions. The Covington goal at every level is to provide a biblical curriculum that will support the pastoral and ministry efforts of those who are studying for the ministry.
