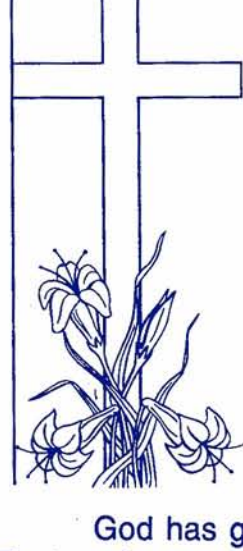

### Bloggling!

Because of employee downsizing in an already underpaid job market, they are part of the poverty level population as defined by the National Consensus Bureau. According to the 2010 statistics, 14% of Missouri and 12.6% of Illinois residents fall within poverty levels, up 2% in both states from the 2000 census. As a result, 1 in 8 people in our area are food insecure.
