

Private Lesson Study includes the following as appropriate to each student's particular situation:

- 1.) *Private lesson study*: Development of skills and knowledge pertaining to the performance and understanding of a particular instrument.
- 2.) Traditional Recital Performance

Offered at the conclusion of each semester, the performances provide insight to the larger meaning of music and its potential as a means of communication and as a means for spiritual expression. Technical and artistic preparations during lessons provide students with the opportunity to develop confidence in public performance. All recital opportunities are optional.

3.) Service Opportunities

Solo and ensemble sharing of musical gifts in community service projects and in church worship settings. The purpose here is to teach students to give of their music to enrich the lives of others. All service opportunities are optional.

Adult Lessons

Many adults are taking music lessons, whether beginners or brushing up on lessons from childhood. Reasons are varied including relaxation, stress release, or simple enjoyment. Numerous studies of adults ranging in age from 70's to 90's have shown the important role learning a new instrument can have in memory enhancement, implications in prevention of dementia, and enhanced physical abilities, such as coordination and even the improvement of eyesight and hearing. Daytime lessons available!

Suzuki Violin Lessons at Mount Calvary Academy for ages 3.5 and older

Shared Suzuki lessons means that a maximum of three children share a lesson consisting both of private instruction and group musical activities. Suzuki violin

lessons are also offered as private lessons. Early beginnings are crucial for developing muscle coordination and mental processes. Actual music reading begins after the basic principles of playing the instrument are acquired, just as learning to read is done after the native language is established. Parents attend lessons with their child and learn with the teacher how to create the right environment for learning at home. (for more info, go to www.mcaom.org)

Group Lessons

Take lessons with your friends for a reduced rate group lesson! Work on duets or trios, keep your skills fresh and growing! Group lessons are also available with instructor approval at the following per student rates, assuming 30 minute lessons:

Groups of 2: Tier 1-\$20.40 Tier 2-\$23.15 Groups of 3 or more: Tier 1-\$15 Tier 2-\$17

Tuition

Private lesson instruction is offered in weekly sessions of 30, 45, and 60 minutes. Students may choose their desired lesson length, or may consult their instructor to determine the lesson length appropriate for their study. Private 30-minute lessons are \$30 or \$34 per lesson. The higher rate is charged for teachers with advanced degrees or extensive performance experience. Charges for longer lessons are adjusted on a pro rata basis. (See registration form.) Tuition is billed per term, based on the number of lessons in the term. Tuition does not include the cost of music.



Term Length

Summer 2016 consists of up to 11 lessons from Monday, June 13-Friday, August 26. *No Lessons Monday, July 4*

Missed Lessons

Please call or email your teacher directly (not the Academy office) if you must miss a lesson. If possible, please communicate this information at least 24 hours prior to the scheduled lesson. You will find teacher contact information listed on page 10 under the heading: <u>Teacher Contact Information</u>. Prior notification, however, does not exempt the student from payment. Students are charged for all lessons for which they have registered, including those missed through student absence.

The only student absence for which a make-up lesson is guaranteed is absence due to the observance of a religious holiday. All other student absences (i.e. family vacation, schedule conflicts, illness, etc...) will be made up at the teacher's discretion, as time permits. **Teachers are encouraged to offer a make-up lesson for up to two student absences.**

If a lesson must be cancelled by the instructor, a makeup lesson will be offered at a mutually acceptable time, or a credit/refund may be requested for the lesson not received.

Withdrawal and Refunds

Notice of withdrawal from individual instruction and refund requests must be made in writing to the Academy of Music office. In fairness to our instructors who have committed one of their teaching slots to the student and require time to fill the vacancy created by the withdrawal, following a student's first lesson a minimum of two lessons notice must be given before refunds will be applied. Refunds, if applicable, will be based on the number of lessons remaining following this two lesson notice to instructors at the time written notice is received. No refunds will be allowed for withdrawal requests made in the last four weeks of a term. The registration and split payment fees are nonrefundable.

Financial Aid

Registration Process

It's easy to register for lessons and classes with the Academy—

Once we have received your registration, we will contact you to place your student with an instructor and to determine a lesson day and time.

Students are welcome to enroll at any time during a term.

Payment Options

Payment of tuition and other fees under the selected payment plan is due prior to the student's first lesson. A non-refundable registration fee of \$5 is due for each student along with tuition at the time of enrollment. Families with more than one student enrolled at the same time will receive a 5% discount on tuition for each enrolled student.

Students may select from the following payment options:

Payment in full

Full term payment in cash, check or Visa/MasterCard prior to the first lesson.

Split Payment Plan

Families may elect to use a two-payment plan. There is an additional administrative split payment fee of \$10 associated with this option. Fifty percent of your tuition is due at the time of enrollment, along with registration and split payment fees. Split payments will be accepted only by method of Visa/Master **Card**. Please include your card member information on the registration form.

Split Payment Charge Date

The second payment will be automatically applied to your card at the midpoint of the term.

Late Fees

A late fee of \$10 will be added to any payments not received by their designated due date – this includes initial tuition payment as well as second half split payments.



Academy Holidays

In situations where a regularly scheduled lesson time conflicts with a national or religious holiday, a makeup lesson will be arranged.

Tardiness

Due to tight lesson schedules, students who are late for a lesson cannot be guaranteed their full lesson

Inclement Weather

In the event of inclement weather, Mount Calvary Academy of Music will post closing announcements and updates on our website, Facebook, public news media, voicemail and building entrance. The Academy will also automatically close if Minnetonka ISD#276 or Mount Calvary Lutheran Church close due to weather. If weather is deteriorating as the day/evening progresses, please contact your respective teachers at the number listed in this handbook for an update on their individual status or to inform them if you are unable to make a lesson.

Inclement weather closings are considered "Acts of God" cancellations caused by neither student nor instructor. One "Academy Closed - inclement weather day" per term may occur with no makeup or credit for a single Academy Closed cancelled lesson. A make-up lesson is encouraged if time allows. Second and subsequent inclement weather closures will initiate a make-up lesson at a mutually acceptable time if possible. If no mutually acceptable time is possible a family may request a credit from Mount Calvary Academy of Music for the second and subsequent inclement weather lessons not received. Credits for second and subsequent weather closures will only be issued by Mount Calvary Academy of Music when requested by a family and a make-up lesson was not received. Make-up lessons or credits will only be guaranteed for Mount Calvary Academy of Music inclement weather closings. All other weather related missed lessons by student or instructor will be subject to our Missed Lessons policy.



Early Childhood Summer Music Classes

Peter and the Wolf

Who: Ages 5-9

When: Mondays, June 20 & 27 1:30-2:30pm

Tuition: \$35

Learn about the instrument families through the musical story of *Peter and the* Wolf. Students will be exposed to the symphony orchestra and the composer Prokofiev. Students will have the opportunity to play all the instruments featured in the story: flute, clarinet, oboe, bassoon, violin, French horn and the timpani. The class will also act out the story representing the characters: the bird, duck, cat, grandpa, Peter, wolf, and the hunters.

Music for Little Mozarts: Meet the Music Friends

Who: Ages 4-6

When: Mondays, July 11-August 8 1:30-2:15pm

Early childhood music programs are a great way to teach the whole child. Through music and movement the child develops mentally, physically, emotionally and socially.



Music for Little Mozarts is designed to introduce children 4-6 years of age to music and the piano. The lessons include singing, attentive listening, and creative movement. There will be rhythm activities played on simple instruments such as rhythm sticks, shakers and drums. There will also be discovery and beginning activities at the keyboard. Music appreciation and musical concepts such as pitch, dynamics and tempo are taught with the help of our music friends Beethoven Bear and Mozart Mouse. Music for Little Mozarts is based on the National Standards for Music Education and has received a Parents' Choice Approved seal, which indicates a wholesome product that helps children enjoy developing physical, emotional, social or academic skills. This class would be the perfect preparation for the child who is interested in starting private instruction in the fall. The student will use Music for Little Mozarts-Meet the Music Friends workbook in class and at home to enhance musical learning. The Session will wrap up with a short performance at the last class.

Classroom guidelines:

Parents or guardians are welcome, but not required to participate with their child. All should be dressed comfortably for an active class and leave toys and snacks at home or in your car. Please let the instructor know of any special needs or concerns.
