On the first day of spring my mom, Virginia Hamm, had the privilege of meeting Jesus face-to-face in heaven. While it was very sad for me and my family, it was the most amazing moment for her, I am convinced. My mom taught my siblings and me so many wonderful lessons, a few which I share with you:

1. Yes. Jesus loves YOU. The most important lesson Mom taught us from the time we were little was the simple truth that Jesus loves us and has a wonderful plan for all who put their trust in Him. He showed it through His life on earth and death for us and proved it through His resurrection. Mom really wanted everyone to know that. How cool that she gets to celebrate Resurrection Sunday this year in heaven.

2. Life matters - All of the time. After Mom gave

her time to raising us kids, she focused her energies on reaching out to young women facing unintended pregnancies. She worked tirelessly to bring awareness to the needs of the unborn by helping found Her Health Women's Center, (formerly the Alpha Center). She spoke wherever and whenever she could about the harmful effects of abortion

to young women, their families and communities. She

wanted everyone to know that human Life is a gift to be celebrated, no matter the size, level of development, the environment, or degree of dependency of that life.

3. Do Everything With Excellence. Mom knew that every aspect of the center needed to reflect God's character. She didn't want things done sloppily or to look cheap. She sought out people who could teach her the ins and outs of running an organization effectively. She made sure the center was a place of beauty and not junk to welcome young women in a difficult situation. She planned banquets for hundreds of guests and spoke to many groups, all in the pursuit of excellence. "Our God," she said, "deserves nothing less. He gave His best for us. We ought also to do the same for Him."

Mom lived with purpose and a desire to serve the Lord with all her heart. I am so thankful to call her Mom. What a legacy of faith she has left behind!
