



## **Stewardship Reflection**

We celebrate today the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ — Corpus Christi. As Catholics we have celebrated this since the 13th Century. On Holy Thursday we celebrate the Last Supper, but the Church, feeling that the proximity of Easter might lessen that, instituted this Solemnity to occur right after the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, which we commemorated last Sunday.

We often speak of Holy Days of Obligation. This is one of the ten Holy Days of Obligation in the Latin Rite Church, but here in the United States it is celebrated on Sunday. Sunday, of course, is always a Holy Day of Obligation for us. As stewards of the Church it is vital that we understand our Catholic traditions and practices and are able to explain them.

The emphasis on this Feast Day is Holy Communion, the Eucharist. At Communion we receive the True Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. We are a gifted people, and this is an incredible gift to us. On this day especially we are called to focus on this gift. In Communion we receive gifts that affect us both physically and spiritually. From a spiritual perspective we are united with Christ. Communion should increase our love of God and of our neighbor. This is lived out in the action of stewardship.

#### **FAMILY AND RESPECT LIFE**

The promotion of life from conception until natural death is the teaching of the Church. This month the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops is releasing a video "Jeanette's Story: 15 Years Later" promoting life and standing against assisted suicide. In 2000, when Oregon resident Jeanette Hall was told she had less than a year to live, she asked her cancer doctor for the pills to commit suicide. Dr. Kenneth Stevens got to know her better and inspired her to consider treatment. The tumor just "melted away" and now, 15 years later, Jeanette says: "It's great to be alive!".

The video concludes with a beautiful quotation from Dr. Stevens about how the Hippocratic Oath applies to his practice of medicine: "I took the ancient oath to do no harm. I will always care for my patients & never abandon them. For me, helping them commit suicide would be the ultimate abandonment."

# Transitions...Observations & Advice (subject to change)

- As we look to a change in pastors, I thought I would offer some observations and advice about what we may expect in the coming months at our parishes. Remember things are always subject to change as we continue through life. Pastoral Region anecdotes:
- Make working together a priority. This means working together within each individual parish
  and with each other as parishes sharing a pastor. It is apparent that OLOS and Holy Name are
  each unique, but within families siblings can be opposites but still come together as family
  when needed.
  - For now (at least the next year), Holy Family in Middletown will continue to operate on their own with only minimal shared services with our two parishes. Father Civille is not going to retire at this time.
- OLOS and HN will continue to share a priest. This is a collaborative region and is not an implied merger. In a collaborative region, independent parishes work together under one pastor and maintain separate financial entities. In a merger, canon law requires a combination of finances and typically a new parish name.
- Different is not wrong. There are generally a number of options for presiders when leading
  Mass or other liturgies. When Father does something different than his predecessor, it is simply
  different and not wrong. Each priest has his own style and preferences. Don't sweat the small
  stuff.
- Even with a change as big as a new pastor, recognize more will come in the future. Mass times for Sundays, weekdays, and holy days need to be reviewed to make sure our priest resources and worship spaces are used to maximum efficiency. Shared staff between the parishes and office hours at each location, as well as shared ministries (religious education, RCIA, youth ministry, music ministry, penance & prayer services, etc.) all may be up for review and possible sharing.

There are a lot of things to think about. Times are changing and the Church is taking new actions to reflect the shortage of priests. As the shortage continues, we look to new ways of being Church and remain open to the guidance of the Archdiocese and influence of the Holy Spirit.

Let's continue on our journey with God and each other.
