

Stewardship Reflection

This First Sunday of Advent marks the beginning of a new liturgical year. All the readings during this period of waiting and anticipation concentrate on making us aware that it is time for us to awaken our lives as Christians. Jesus opens our Gospel Reading from St. Mark by saying "Be watchful! Be alert!" and closes it with an intense "Watch!"

For many Advent and Christmas are times of light, whether it is the light of the candles on Advent wreaths or the lights on a tree or the festive lights which decorate many houses and businesses. Jesus brings light into our worlds, but we must allow this light to permeate our own lives, to enter into the dark and sinful parts of our lives to illuminate and cleanse them.

There is a natural wonder among children at this time of year, but sometimes as we age, we lose that sense as if we are sleeping. It is time to awaken. Our minds may say "Let go" but our spirituality tells us to "Awaken." We are filled with spiritual depths. It is time to seek them, find them, and awaken them. It is Advent, time for us to awaken and become aware of the gifts of love we have received from God and others. Or as Jesus reminds us: "Watch."

NATIONAL SHRINE OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION COLLECTION - DECEMBER 8

Pope BI. Pius IX named Blessed Virgin Mary, under the title of the Immaculate Conception, patroness of the United States, in 1847. In 1900, a bishop suggested building a national shrine, comparable to the great sanctuaries in Europe. In 1913, Pope St. Pius X gave his support and papal contribution. Later that year, a parcel of land was designated for the construction of the National Shrine. The foundation stone of what would be the Shrine's Crypt Church was laid 1920.

The Great Depression, and World War II brought a halt to construction until the Marian Year 1953-54 when the American Bishops renewed the effort and Catholics responded to the fundraising and structure began to rise in 1955. St. John Paul II conferred the title of "Basilica" to the Shrine in 1990.

The National Collection December 8—The Bishops of the United States approved a special one-time second collection for the Trinity Dome. 
THE ATHENAEUM—MT. ST. MARY SEMINARY

THE SOLEMNITY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION

It's important to understand what the doctrine of the Immaculate Conception is and what it is not. Some people think the term refers to Christ's conception in Mary's womb without the intervention of a human father; but that is the Virgin Birth. Others think the Immaculate Conception means Mary was conceived "by the power of the Holy Spirit," in the way Jesus was, but that, too, is incorrect. The Immaculate Conception means

that Mary, whose conception was brought about the normal way, was conceived without original sin or its stain—that is what "immaculate" means: without stain. The essence of original sin consists in the deprivation of sanctifying grace, and its stain is a corrupt nature. Mary was preserved from these defects by God's grace; from the first instant of her existence she was in the state of sanctifying grace and was free from the corrupt nature original sin brings.
