Stewardship Reflection

Holy Scripture, the Word of God, is filled with so much meaning for us each and every week, if we only listen carefully and absorb what we are being told. In the last verse of today's First Reading we hear, "Then they laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit." It is speaking of Sts. Peter and John who traveled to Samaria to more or less confirm those who had been baptized there.

In fact, most historians believe that the laying on of hands in the New Testament is the origin of the Sacrament of Confirmation. In the *Apostolic Constitution on the Sacrament of Confirmation* Pope Paul VI affirmed that laying on of hands in the sacrament of confirmation continues the grace of Pentecost (on Sunday, June 4 this year).

If you have been confirmed, you have experienced the "laying on of hands." That means the Holy Spirit has been called to bless, sanctify, transform, and give grace to you. You have received the Holy Spirit, which is the ongoing life of the Church. You have been anointed with the Spirit of God. That means you have been called to not only live out that Spirit, but also to live a life which shares that Spirit with your parish and with others.

When the priest or Bishop imposes hands, it is called epiclesis, a Greek word that means "invocation." The "laying on of hands" is an important part of the ordination of priests and deacons. St. Paul reminded us all in his First Letter to Timothy, "Do not neglect the gift you have, which was conferred on you through the prophetic word with the imposition of hands."

THE ASCENSION OF OUR LORD: We tend to think along a sequence, especially when it come to the passing of time. One hour follows another, one year follows another and so on. The life of Jesus can easily look like this - after Holy Week of Jesus' passion came the Easter of His resurrection, and His various appearances and now we come to his Ascension, and then Pentecost.

First, Jesus Christ, by his Ascension we don't mean that He used to be God up in heaven, that He then lived among as a man for about 33 years, and then following His resurrection He ascended back into heaven as the God He had been all along but had put aside for a while. Jesus would then start to look like some kind of meteorite that came from far away in outer space, appeared briefly to our planet, and then went away again to some far off, inaccessible place.

By His Ascension, by being taken up into heaven, Jesus Christ has changed how we live in time, not just how He lives. Christ has sanctified time, made it holy and livable. He has given its flow a clear direction, a definite end (in every sense of this last word). Jesus' time on earth came to an end, and so has our time started to end.

This is the certain hope of renewal, transformation and knowledge. It is in this hope that Christians can spend their lives in good actions, not afraid that goodness will be undone and blotted out by the passing of time. Glad too that the evil done in the past can be repented and forgiven.

We ask ourselves: What can last? Who can last? Yet the good done, the virtues lived out, the people we become under grace will not be dissolved by the unstoppable passage of time. Life is not a succession of moments that don't add up to anything.

By His Ascension at the right-hand of God, Jesus, as it were, has made a human space within God for us to be welcomed into. Already we are welcomed, although we do not yet dwell there fully or with absolute certainty. Already this union with God happens when we live in the virtues of faith, hope and charity, even if this union is precarious because time can undo us as well as make us. The ascended Jesus gives to humanity the time and the space to flourish. Eventually, please God, we too shall be taken up into heaven and resurrected beyond the reach of time.
