

Stewardship Reflection

Shepherds and sheep were so much a part of life for Jesus and those from Galilee. Galilee was, after all, largely a rural area and raising sheep and sheepherding was an intricate part of their lives. That is why the image of a shepherd with his sheep was so often used during biblical times. It was a connection with which people could identify.

It is equally important for us today to understand this important cultural connection for them. Shepherding was all about feeding the lambs and the sheep (recall that Jesus tells Peter "Feed my sheep."), bringing them to good pasture lands and water ("The Lord is my shepherd...He makes me lie down in green pastures; he leads me beside quiet waters; he restores my soul."); going after lost lambs ("Does he not leave the ninety-nine in the open country and go after the lost sheep until he finds it?"); and protects the sheep in the field and the fold ("The watchman opens the gate, and the sheep listen to his voice.").

Our Gospel reading today comes from St. John 10: 1-10. In St. John 10: 11, the next verse, Christ declares "I am the good shepherd; the good shepherd lays down his life for his sheep." As Catholics and Christians, we, too, are called to be Good Shepherds to all those with whom we come in contact. It may be from another culture than ours, but we should understand full well the implications of that.

THE KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS NEWS

One hundred and thirty-five years ago, Father McGivney gathered a small group of Catholic men in the basement of St. Mary's Church in New Haven, Conn. Small in number, yet noble in ambition and strong in faith, these men were determined to provide financial protection and spiritual support for families of their parish. Although it has been more than a century since Father McGivney brought these men together, his example of Christian charity is timeless, a fact that Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori of Baltimore shared during a Mass celebrated at St. Mary's Church on March 29, 2017. "There is something timeless about people who are holy, because their lives speak to each new generation. Such is the case with Father McGivney," Archbishop Lori explained in his homily. "Father McGivney's priestly holiness is timeless and is just as relevant for us today as it was when he ministered to the people in this very church."

After Mass, Archbishop Lori led supreme officers and their wives went to the sarcophagus of Father McGivney, located in the rear of the church, where they recited the Prayer for Canonization. The prayer was written in 2008, when the Vatican recognized the heroic virtue of Father McGivney and declared him a venerable Servant of God.

Commitment to family life is the core of the Knights of Columbus's beliefs and ideals. MEMBERSHIP IN THE KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS is open to men 18 years of age or older who are practicing Catholics in union with the Holy See. New ideas and youthful energy are attributes that young men, especially young fathers, can bring to the council.
