Dear Ones in Christ Jesus,

As everyone recently reading *The Beacon*, worshiping God with us on Sundays, receiving our weekly emailed "*Updates*" or attending one of our many ministry team meetings knows, this is "Stewardship Season!"

You're probably tired of hearing us announce, write about, and preach about "stewardship." Our Stewardship Team has been working diligently to emphasize that rightly practiced Christian Stewardship impacts every area and aspect of personal, social, economic, and spiritual life.

While these three weeks of testimonies, liturgies, hymns, and homilies have not concentrated our attention on matters of our financial responsibilities, stewardship there is a moment in this series when we'll focus on "the budget." Through the financial side of our church life we seek to make a transformative difference in the lives of members and our community, and that "ain't cheap!"

Anyone who reads our communication tools (this newsletter, weekly worship guides, our Website (www.sebastianumc.com), our Facebook page and "Bursts", occasional ads in local media, and our weekly "Update," at the very least, becomes aware of the multiple settings in which ministry takes place in Christ's name both within and beyond our walls.

Our mission as Methodist Christians is straightforward: "To make disciples of Jesus Christ through the Transformation of the World," beginning right at home, here in Sebastian and extending outward.

We **reach "in"** to touch the lives of our friends and members as we gather for worship, in joy-filled musical celebrations, through Bible study in several settings, in small prayer groups, spiritual growth groups, and missional outreach to others through our United Methodist Women, members of Church Women United, and UM Men.

We **reach out** to our community in our youth and children's ministries through our Sebastian Boys and Girls Club and Sebastian Women's Club and through our Brownie and Girl Scout "troops." We minister to families affected by addictions through ALANON, and we extend our facilities to groups specializing in artistic creation, medical condition support, rehabilitation, and growth as well. All we offer and engage, we do in the name of Jesus Christ!

We **reach "in"** as well to provide opportunities for the stewardship of community building. Consider the labors of love and patience expressed each Sunday by members who prepare refreshments for our now-quite famous-in-the-community Coffee Hour Ministry and monthly Fellowship Covered Dish Dinners. Note also hose members who compassionately extend themselves to families in grief through the ministry of food.

You've contributed thousands of hours of volunteer service through our SUMC Thrift Store Ministry. We need opportunities to "forget ourselves on behalf of others"... critically important opportunities for spiritual growth. As a bonus to everyone who financially supports ministry here, The Thrift Shop provides financial resources for approximately 40% of our annual budget! Without the financial result of these volunteer efforts Sebastian UMC would fiscally and programmatically a very different church.

But now comes a moment of truth, a moment of spiritual introspection, a moment of risk taking. The most difficult component of discipleship and church membership is <u>financial</u> stewardship. Yep, the ministry of our checkbooks, bank accounts, wallets, and purses. No disciple can escape this aspect of stewardship. Even though it involves the invitation to sacrificially sharing, giving money is truly a small component of our larger compassionate ministry.

Next Sunday we will dedicate our "Estimate of Giving Cards" if we are willing joyfully to "do the best we can" in 2017 in light of what Christ has done and calls us to do.

The bottom line? ... financially, yes, but by no means only financially in the greater terms of stewardship ... the end point of this First Financial Campaign at Sebastian UMC for each of us in more than two decades:

Iust a Note From Megan Mash

So in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith, for all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus. If you belong to Christ, then you are Abraham's seed, and heirs according to the promise. -

Galatians 3:26-29 NIV

Some hymns are not initially written as hymns. "In Christ There Is No East or West" was originally written as part of a libretto. John Oxenham composed the libretto *The Pageant of Darkness and Light* for the London Missionary Society's exhibition in 1908. The theme for the exhibition was "The Orient in London." Oxenham included the poem in 1913 in his book *Bees in Amber*. The theme of the hymn is Christian unity as found in Galatians 3:28. The hymn has been included in USA hymnals since 1920's and in 1935 it entered Methodist hymnals. In preparation for our current hymnal many hymn texts were edited to include more inclusive language. This hymn also underwent some editing. Laurence Hull Stookey was charged to edit the third stanza of the hymn. In correspondence with Carlton Young he wrote this about his experience:

While service on the language and theology subcommittee, [I] became frustrated with the assignment given [me] to revise the words...After numerous unsatisfactory attempts to make Oxenham's language inclusive, [I] decided to write a replacement stanza based on Galatians 3:28.

The text reinforces Paul's letter to the Galatians. We are reminded that in Christ there is "one great fellowship of love throughout the whole wide earth." We are called to be instruments in this fellowship to spread God's love throughout the world. What makes us unique and different is not cause for division in Christ. We are each vital parts in the body of Christ. Our differences are what make the body strong. Our unique calls help us reach out to many more people who are broken and hurting. When we come together in Christ, we can do greater work than we ever could image alone. Christ calls us to work together because "his service is the golden cord close binding humankind." We are all one in Christ, united in love to serve the world.


