Just a Note From Megan Mash

Go, tell it on the mountain, over the hills and everywhere; go, tell it on the mountain that Jesus Christ is born.

. The history of African American spirituals can be hard to trace exactly because they were initially developed and transmitted through an oral tradition. Because of this there exists many variants in melody and text. In our modern culture and with the ease of access to printed information, these spirituals have become available to us and are a part of the way we experience God. "Go, Tell It On the Mountain" has become an integral part of the way we celebrate Christmas. John W. Work, Jr adapted the text and music from traditional sources to make it available to us. He published the verse present in our hymnal because the original ones could not be found. These verses tell the natal narrative as found in the Gospel of Luke. This hymn entered United Methodist hymnals in 1966.

The refrain is probably the most memorable aspect of this hymn. The verses tell us what has happened and the refrain provides us with what our response is to be. We are called to tell the world of the birth of Christ. We are called to do this because we know the ending of the story. We are not simply telling people that a child was born over two thousand years ago. We are telling them this child came and changed the world. Prominent black theologian James H. Cone writes about this hymn in his book The Spirituals and the Blue: An Interpretation. He writes that the birth of Jesus announces the ministry of "the conquering King, and the crucified Lord who has come to bring peace and justice to the dispossessed of the land. That is why the slave wanted to "go tell it on de mountain." The birth is the beginning of the coming reign of Christ. Because of the oral tradition of the spirituals a variant in the text exists which relates to Easter.

Go, tell it on the mountain, over the hills and everywhere; go, tell it on the mountain that Jesus lives again.

So go and tell the story, over the mountain, over the hills, at the beach, EVERYWHERE! Not just that Jesus Christ has been born but that Jesus lives and because he lives we can have new, everlasting life.
