Facility Improvements

My introduction to IOH was 18 months ago as a first-time volunteer with parishioners from Saint Jude the Apostle Catholic Church. Our goal was to clean an IOH apartment in anticipation of a new incoming family. However, it became clear that the

more complex task of patching, prepping and painting a hallway was needed. Taking on that particular project led to my more personal involvement and commitment to the families of IOH.

Since then, many improvements have been made to the facility. These range from replacing the HVAC system on the second floor; replacing the roof; painting hallways, stairways, the front lobby and the entrance; updating emergency and security lighting; and completing the inspection of fire protection systems. All of these much needed projects were funded and accomplished through the generosity of individual donors, supporting churches and community advocates.

As the volunteer Facilities Manager at IOH, I have had the honor of getting to know the families in residence and bear witness to their challenges, courage and hope. I am inspired by their efforts to take advantage of the opportunity at IOH and secure a more promising future. In speaking with the residents, I have come to understand that the most valued aspect of the program is the safe, private apartments. Unlike homeless shelters, IOH allows families to stay together and maintain their privacy and dignity.

Over time, it has become clear that my service and mission at IOH is less about maintaining a building and more about empowering families to rebuild their lives. I feel blessed to be part of IOH, an organization that embraces the marginalized and forgotten members of our society while they become stronger families and community members.

Honoring Sister Carolyn Oberkirch By Suzette Snell

RSM, was welcomed "home" for the dedication of the IOH activity room in her honor. Sister Carolyn was instrumental in the founding of IOH.

Sister Carolyn came to Our Lady of the Assumption Catholic Church (OLA) in 1974 to teach first grade. After six years, her focus shifted to outreach ministry for the elderly and homeless. Working with a group of 25 churches and synagogues, she strived to find a long-term solution for families in crisis in Northeast Atlanta. At the time, the only solution was to offer these families a motel room and a bag of groceries. Sister Carolyn was determined to offer them a 'hand up' instead.

With unflagging energy and determination, Sister Carolyn fought to build a haven where families in crisis could live together, go to work, attend school and build a foundation for the future. She inspired others to join in her efforts and construction commenced on
