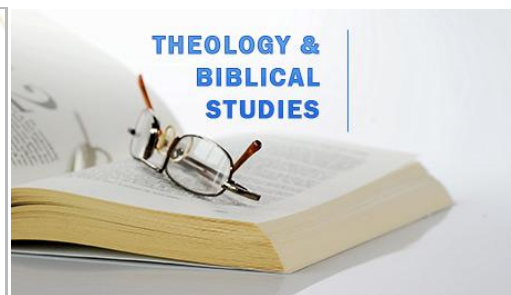
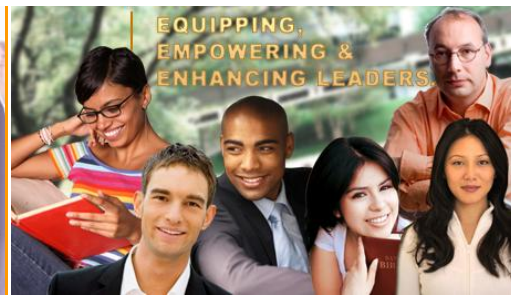
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Welcome

Textbooks, Supplementary Reading and study assignments apply for some programs. An essay exam is written after each course. Students earn 3 credits by taking each course and submitting the essay exam.

EXAM, ESSAY

Students are required to write an Essay: 10-12 pages, Font 12, double-spaced.

Degrees are earned by taking courses and writing a monthly essay after completion of each course for the accumulation of credits. Completion of each course earns three credits.



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DEGREE PROGRAMS

Students must maintain a grade point average of 3.0 (B) or higher in order to qualify for the Bachelor, Master and Doctoral Degrees.

Available Degrees:

- Bachelor of Theology or Ministry or Christian Leadership and Management
- Master of Theology or Ministry or Christian Leadership and Management
- Doctorate of Theology or Ministry or Christian Leadership and Management

STUDENT'S POLICY

Students must fill out an application, register and pay fee before attending classes.

Each student may enroll as a **graded student** (for credits, monthly exam) or as an **audit student** (no credits, no exams).

Application Fee is \$50, Payable to KCLIH.

A **passport size picture** must also be provided with each filled out Application Form and fee enclosed. Students will earn credits by taking classes and writing their exams.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES FOR STUDENTS

The items listed below constitute an applicant's credentials upon which a decision for admission is based.

1. Student completes Application Form.
2. Student submits a passport size colored photo along with application.
3. Students pay a \$50 non-refundable application fee (Submitted to KCLIH).

The Application Form must be completed and signed by the student. All information requested must be answered. **Any student who has not taken a course as a graded or audit student within the last year will be considered inactive and must submit a new application for admission and pay a new application fee before taking additional courses.** Returning students need not submit new high school transcripts, or photos, but must complete all other sections of the application form.

STUDENT STATUS

A student may choose to be at a **"Graded" status (with exam)** or **"Audit" status (without exam)**. All individuals must have a declared status. No individual student who is unaccounted for at the KCLI headquarters is allowed to remain in a class. All students are required to purchase a Workbook for each course. A student may be allowed to be a **"Guest Student"** if he or she intends to join the school and would like to experience the school prior to joining.

Graded Status

Students enroll, write essay exams and earn 3 credits for each course.

Graded students are required to attend all lectures and complete final examinations and other course assignments. It is best that students write their exam as soon as possible after each course when the lecture remains fresh in their minds. Exams are due 3 weeks after each course.

Audit Status

Students enroll; pay fees (same for all students) take classes but choose not to do exams. Jesus taught the disciples with a "Rabbinic" style of Christian Education, Training and Leadership. Audited students have the opportunity to gain knowledge and receive Kingdom impartation from our great Teachers and Faculty. No credits are earned. Students may receive "Certificate of Completion". Students must purchase Workbook and attend class. Students are empowered with Biblical knowledge and impartation.



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Audit students will receive “audit recognition” and recorded at the KCLI headquarters. All audit students must have an application for admission on file at the National Headquarters. Audit students must register and pay fees prior to course.

Audit students may convert from an “audit” status to a “graded” status later by submitting application and paying required fees. Audit students are required to retake a course or take a challenge exam as a graded student in order to receive credits.

Admission Requirements

All students 18 years old and over are welcomed to study at KCLI.

Guest Students

Potential students may temporarily sit in one course as the guest of the local campus as permitted by the Administrator. In such cases, a guest must purchase Workbook and “sit in” class to determine whether to enroll as a student at the local center. **Guests may be allowed to attend ONE COURSE ONLY.**

EXAMINATION POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

Students are required to write a 10-12 page Essay, typed with Font 12 and double-spaced.

Degrees are earned by taking courses and writing an essay after completion of each course. Credits will be accumulated for diploma or degree status. Supplementary Reading Books (SRB) are required for some courses. KCLI policy allows up to **two months** for students to complete the essay exam after each course. However, it is best that student write their exam as soon as possible after each course when the lecture remains fresh in their minds. Completion of each course earns 3 credits.

All exams are “open-book.” Students may refer to course materials when they write their exams.

STUDENTS MAY NOT WORK TOGETHER ON EXAMINATIONS. EACH STUDENT MUST TAKE THE EXAMINATION INDEPENDENTLY.

GRADES, QUALITY POINTS and GRADE POINT AVERAGES

Letter and numerical grades are issued to students completing course requirements and are reflected on grade reports issued by the KCLI Headquarters. Grades and grade points are based on the following official grading scale:

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A specific grade point average (GPA) must be maintained to receive diplomas from KCLI. The normal credit load for a full-time student is 30 credits within one calendar year. This is earned upon completion of 10 courses.

TIME LIMITATIONS

It is best that student write their exam as soon as possible after each course when the lecture remains fresh in their minds. Exams are due 3 weeks after each course.

TRANSCRIPT REQUESTS

A student may request an Official Transcript of his/her studies with KCLI by submitting a Transcript Request Form along with payment of \$5 for each copy of the transcript requested to the national headquarters, attention, Registrar. Generally, these requests will be processed within 30 days. To ensure privacy of student information, the request must be in writing and signed by the student. No “unofficial” transcripts will be issued. A copy of the Transcript Request Form will be sent to you.

DIPLOMA, DEGREES, GRADUATION

Diplomas can be issued with or without graduation and can be applied for at any time as long as the student qualifies. Students may obtain diplomas at any time after completion of credits. Students participating in graduation ceremony must have received the required credits and grade point average to receive the requested diploma.

A Graduation Ceremony will be performed in celebration of the achievements of our KCLI students who have worked hard, and with great commitment earned their diplomas.

GRADUATION CEREMONY

The Graduation Ceremony is a celebration of God’s Kingdom disciples who have responded to God’s encouragement to, “Study, do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a workman who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly handles the word of truth.” 2 Timothy 2:15 God’s promise to His graduates is: “The people who know their God shall be strong, and carry out great exploits.” Daniel 11:32. We rejoice with those who rejoice at their personal achievement in preparation for greater possibilities. It is a time of celebration, affirmation and impartation. Graduates should be encouraged to invite family and friends and also celebrate after the ceremony with food and fellowship.

GRADUATION/COMMENCEMENT POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

Each student must fill out and submit a Graduation Application Form. Transcripts will be verified and followed by a Graduation Verification Form submitted with fee of \$100 for each student. The Office of the Registrar of KCLI must be notified of the date of the graduation ceremony and receive Graduation Verification Forms with fees at least two (2) month before the expected graduation date. The director or administrator of the local campus should review the students’ records to ensure the students are eligible for graduation before submitting graduation requests.

Graduation forms

The Administrator of the affiliate campus must submit a Diploma/Graduation Application Form for each student to the KCLI Headquarters with Diploma Fee of \$75 + Verification Fee (of credits) of \$25. Please carefully submit accurate information, including the name to appear on the diploma. A \$25.00 fee will be charged to the local campus to reprint a diploma or degree.



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Required Credits and Grades

Students expecting to graduate must have received the required credits at the time the graduation request is made. That is, examinations must be graded, grades posted at the KCLI Headquarters and grade reports received at the local campus. This is necessary because of the lag time associated with grading and posting of grades with the registrar and completing a thorough records check. Students expecting to graduate must also have achieved the required grade point average (GPA) at the time the graduation request is made. A (GPA) of 2.0 "C" is required to receive the Associate Degree. A (GPA) of 3.0 "B" is required to receive all the degrees.

Diplomas and Degrees

After all record checks are completed and all monies have been paid in full, the diploma order is placed with KCLI. Completed Diplomas will be shipped at least two weeks before the graduation date. Costs associated with the issuance of diploma/degree are listed on the Diploma Application Form. The date on the diploma will be the date of issue from the KCLI Headquarters, or the date of the graduation at the local campus. If a student does not participate in the local campus graduation and later requests a diploma, it will be dated on the date of issue from the KCLI Headquarters.

The Graduation Ceremony

The President, Vice President, Director or Administrator of Kingdom Covenant Leadership Institute or other authorized officers and members of the Board of Directors are approved to conduct commencements each year. At the time of your request, please state whether or not a formal address to the graduates, a sermon, or just brief remarks are desired. Please allocate at least one hour for rehearsal of the commencement ceremony. If the commencement is to be conducted on Sunday morning, then a Saturday night rehearsal should be scheduled. If it is a Sunday night event, a rehearsal should be scheduled an hour and a half before the start of the commencement ceremony.

Academic Regalia

All graduates will be required to wear caps and gowns for the ceremony.

EVALUATION OF ACCREDITED THEOLOGICAL OR OTHER COLLEGE COURSES

An **Evaluation Committee** will assess earned college credits in secular or theological fields.

Active students who have completed courses in institutions other than KCLI may receive recognition for their work. It is the student's responsibility to gather the appropriate supporting documents (official transcripts, certificates, diplomas and/or a ministerial resume) to be submitted with the initial request for Evaluation of Prior Learning.

Students with Theological Diplomas or Degrees

Students having earned college credits in theology or other courses may receive full or partial recognition for their work. This placement is determined by the evaluation of official transcripts submitted by the requesting student and endorsed by the **Evaluation Committee of KCLIH**. Credits will be transferred to KCLI. Courses must have a GPA of 2.0 (C) or higher. Grades of D or below will not be accepted.

Students with Bachelor Degree (Secular)

Students with secular Bachelor Degrees and many years of Christian Service, seminars, and special Christian training may be advanced to work towards a Master Level Theological Degree.



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Students with Master Degree (Secular)

Students with secular Master Degrees and many years of Christian Service, seminars, and special Christian training may be awarded “one year of Master Level credits, and advanced to needing only 30 more credits (10 courses) to obtain a Master of Theology or Christian Leadership and Management. With only 10 courses this student will have two Master Degrees.

Students with Ph.D. (Secular)

Students with a secular Ph.D. and many years of Christian Service, seminars, and special Christian training may be awarded one year of Master Level credits, and advance to needing only 30 more credits (10 courses) to obtain a Master of Theology or Christian Leadership and Management. With only 10 courses this student will earn a Master of Theology or a Master of Christian Leadership and Management. Students with a secular Ph.D. and no Christian Experience will do Christian Foundation Classes and enroll in KCLI to begin the journey of Christian Education and Biblical knowledge. No prior credits will be awarded towards a Theological Degree.

NON-ACCREDITED EDUCATIONAL EXPERIENCES

Students may receive recognition and credits for special training seminars, Christian service, missions, or other educational experiences. A tuition fee of \$5.00 per credit is required. These experiences are evaluated very carefully and a limited number of credits may be earned in this manner.

GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR EVALUATION OF PRIOR LEARNING

The Evaluation Committee follows these general guidelines in awarding credits to prior learning: Individuals must be active registered students before requesting an evaluation of work for which they hope to receive recognition. Initial requests for an evaluation of prior learning must be submitted within six months of enrollment. Credits awarded are officially applied to a student’s transcript only upon completion of the residency requirement of five courses (15 credits). It is imperative that all appropriate documents be submitted in a single request to KCLIH. There is no processing fee for the initial evaluation. Students requiring evaluation for prior learning must submit all official transcripts, resumes, certificates, diplomas, etc., to the administrator of the local campus. Please do not have transcripts sent from other schools and colleges directly to the Canadian National Headquarters. A request for confirmation and authenticity of transcripts, diplomas, certificates, resumes, etc. may be required resulting in direct communication to the Institute or Organization. A “Request for Evaluation of Prior Learning” form must be completed at the local campus and signed by the Administrator. A copy of this form may be obtained from the local campus. For local campus students, the administrator of the local campus should sign and email this completed form and all student documentation to the KCLIH.
