### **Voter Registration**

#### **St. Andrew Parish Hall, Feb. 28, 2016**

Are you registered to vote? Important votes for Texas and the United States are coming up in May and November. To make your view heard, you must vote, and to vote, you must be registered. You may register to vote any time after you have reached the age of 17 years and 10 months, so that your registration can be processed in time for an election falling on or after you turn 18. Some requirements for TX Voter Eligibility are:

- ✓ You must be a citizen of the United States.
- ✓ You must reside in the county where you are registering.
- ✓ You must not be a convicted felon. If you have a felony conviction, you must have completed your sentencing, paid your fines and completed your parole.
- ✓ You must not have been declared mentally incompetent in a court of law.

The Saint Andrew Task Force will have deputized registrars available after all morning Masses on Feb. 28, 2016, to help you register or to change your information if you are already registered. This could be a name change or an address change.

- Voting is one of the most important rights that you have. By registering, you will be ready for the May and November elections. Your vote counts!!
- Voting is a way to speak your mind and let your voice be heard! Your vote is your voice. When we vote, we are actually telling elected officials how we feel about education, public safety, social security, health care and other important issues.
- One voice, one vote really does count! There is power in numbers, and when we vote, we can truly make a difference.
- Voting changes communities! When we vote, we can get results that we can actually see.
- Vote to effect change! Voting is our chance to make a difference in our own lives and in the world.
- Voting gives you credibility! You can make your top concerns a top priority for legislators.
