<u>Galatians 5:22-23 (NLT)</u>²² But when the Holy Spirit controls our lives, he will produce this kind of fruit in us: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, ²³ gentleness, and self-control. Here there is no conflict with the law.

The Greek word translated "self-control" (NLT) or "temperance" (KJV) is a combination of two words: **EN KRATOS**. "En" means "in" and "kratos" means "strength, power, might, or dominion."
