
Blessing of the Backpacks


ZLYF Back to School BBQ & Water Play

The Homeless Shelter needs diapers and baby wipes. Donations of these items will be delivered there. Thank you!



Jesus answered the crowd, "I tell you, you are looking for me, not because you saw the sign I performed but because you ate the loaves and had your fill. Be careful, do not labor for food that spoils, but for food that endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you." – John 6:26-27

There was a secular song back in the 1980's titled: 'Looking for Love in All the Wrong Places'. While this song had nothing to do with the Christian faith, it underscored a common human frailty, that, at times, our hearts and minds focus on the wrong things. Our obsessions and perceived needs can blind us to the bigger and better things of life. Jesus, in the text above, highlights the spiritual side of this common human frailty.

Jesus, acting in compassion and love, had just miraculously fed a crowd of over 5,000 people. The crowd, seeing the miracle, jumped to a wrong conclusion and decided to try to make Jesus their king, even if they had to do so by force (v15). The crowd had focused on the wrong thing. They had missed the point. The crowd saw in Jesus someone who could make their lives easier and that was enough for them. The feeding of the 5,000, like all of Jesus' miracles, was a sign and invitation to see Jesus for who he truly was. God's Providence IS a reality (Cf. Acts 17:24-27; Matthew 5:45) but this Providence is not the 'end all and be all' of God's purpose. Jesus, in a way, is telling the crowd that they are 'looking for love in the wrong place.' Indeed, the love of God is manifested in the entirety of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. It is in 'this' that we' come to know God and hear his invitation to trust him. This 'faith' is the 'food that endures to eternal life' and is THE gift that God desires for us.

We, like everyone else in this world, are inclined to lower our sights and focus on the temporal. In this passage Jesus invites us to raise our sights and to set our hearts on the deep things of God's heart, which is our redemption and salvation. Jesus, in John 10:10 reminds us of his ultimate purpose saying: 'The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full.' Jesus would have us know this fullness of God's goodness. May we, with the Psalmist, cry out in faith saying: 'I lift up my eyes to the mountains—where does my help come from? My help comes from the LORD, the Maker of heaven and earth.' (Ps. 121:1-2)





We've been talking about Spiritually Vibrant Households, focusing on how welcoming non-family guests—extending hospitality—is a common activity in those households.

What exactly is a Spiritually Vibrant Household? Households that appear to be exceptionally engaged in communal and consistent faith expression in the home were found to have three consistently practiced activities in common: spiritual practices (defined as praying every day or two and reading the Bible weekly all together); spiritual conversations (defined as talking about God and faith at least weekly all together); and hospitality (defined as welcoming non-family guests regularly, or at least several times a month). Households that participate in all of these activities (at this frequency) are what Barna refers to as **Spiritually Vibrant**.

Perhaps the most surprising in this short list is hospitality. But then again, perhaps not. We were created in community, in relationship: "Then God said, "Let **us** make mankind in **our** image, in our likeness, **so** that they..." (Genesis 1:26-27) Our Triune God, in relationship within himself, created people to be in relationship with him and each other, right from the start. The Scriptures consistently call on us to love our neighbor (Lev. 19:18, and Matt. 22: 37-40, among many others) and practice hospitality (Gen 18:1-8, Gen 24: 23-25, Ex 2:20, Ruth 2:14, Acts 28:7, 1 Tim 5:10, Heb 13:2, 1 Pet 4:9 among others).

What is hospitality? Hospitality is the practice and quality of welcoming and receiving guests and strangers in a warm, friendly, and generous way.

We'll be practicing hospitality together again as the family of God on August 25. Join us for another Loud Tables potluck!
