

Submit yourselves, then, to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.

Come near to God and he will come near to you. – James 4:7-8a

This September our Epistle readings come from the Letter of James. Luther once referred to James' epistle as an "Epistle of Straw" (Preface to the New Testament, 1522). With these comments Luther was underscoring the fact that James contains little in terms of the Gospel and can, if misunderstood, lead one to a sinful self-righteous life. Luther, though, never suggested that the Epistle of James did not have a place in the Christian's life. While James is primarily an exposition of God's Law, it is still an expression of God's holy will and as such is valuable for the Christian.

James speaks to us who have already been incorporated into God's family through the gracious action of our Lord. Being the redeemed people of God, James asks, "What character traits should begin to manifest themselves among us?" James speaks of our lives as they are being transformed by the working of the Holy Spirit. This is not the stuff of salvation. James is not speaking about things we do to get right with God, rather he speaks of how our fallen-ness begins to be stripped away by God as we attempt to order our lives according to his will. The holiness of life that James speaks of IS ALREADY the reality of our lives in faith. In God's sight, because of the gift of God's grace in Jesus, we are seen as Jesus—that is, holy and perfect. Our pilgrim journey on this side of heaven, I would suggest, is God's work in us getting us used to our new reality. Ultimately, what James speaks of is not fully perfected until we get to heaven, but as God's redeemed people, we rejoice in our new life and, with the help of the Holy Spirit, we intentionally "work" to put on this new life in Christ.

This pilgrim's journey, as James points out, is not an optional thing. If we think we can keep God boxed up in a pretty package with a bright bow and not let his holy will change us, then we deceive ourselves. James is speaking to the deep-rooted core of our fallen-ness. We, in our rebellion, think that we can continue to serve multiple masters (Romans 7:19). Yes, in our fallen-ness we may intellectually ascent to God and all that God has revealed. We may even rejoice in the news that God's Son has bailed us out of trouble, but our enemy heart still hesitates at the call of God to place ourselves under his will (Philippines 2:5-8).


As we journey through the book of James, we will be challenged, offended, and struck by the harshness of God's Law. We will also need to flee to the shadow of Jesus' cross, for it is only in Jesus that we find life and salvation. James speaks of what God is looking for from us. We need to remember that Jesus is the only perfect man, and that Jesus gave his life because we are not. This is our hope and the content of our salvation. In response to this grace of God, we take this journey of James.

4 Ways Daily Bible Reading Will Change Your Life

Delving into God's Word regularly will give you a brand new perspective.

In today's busy world, it can be difficult to prioritize daily Bible reading. Many of us are dashing about as soon as we wake up, and don't stop moving until we go to bed at night. Even if the desire is there, life often takes precedence over reading the Bible consistently.

Yet, on the days when I don't read God's word because I haven't stopped moving, I notice something—I'm in a bad mood.

This is not a coincidence. We were created to operate within a godly rhythm of work and worship. When all we do is work, we're stretching our body to operate without the essential praise experience we need to replenish ourselves.

If we are to live the lives God designed for us, we must get back to what's essential for us to thrive. We must move against the grain that tries to quicken our pace, slow down and pick up our Bibles. As a result, we'll begin to see the world in a new lens, one colored with the hope and optimism we need to face the day.

As I made it a priority to read my Bible in the morning each day, I found my outlook on life was changing for the better.

Here are the four ways reading the Bible each day can change your life:

1) You'll gain a new insight on your problems.

Bible stories are timeless because they deal with universally human themes like stress, worry, fear, love and hope. The disobedience of the Israelites in the Old Testament, for example, can help you see the messes of your life—and God's mercy and grace towards you—in a new light.

Whatever you're struggling with, let the powerful stories of the Bible better clarify what you're going through.

2) You'll see God in a new light.

It's difficult to notice God throughout your day when you forget how He operates. By reading the Bible each day, you can keep the nature of God and how He works at the forefront of your mind so you'll always notice when He's working in your own life.

3) You'll refocus your attention on what's important.

When you're busy, your mind is focused on yourself, what you have to do and how you're feeling. But reading the Bible expands your perspective. It reorients you back to what's important, like giving God His due time with you first and attending to your family, friends and neighbors in love.

If you find your mind is stuck on yourself, let the words of the Bible carry you to a godly perspective—that everyone in your day matters.

4. You'll make better choices.

The Bible teaches us that, "out of the heart the mouth speaks." Without even being conscious of it, we can store up sinful things in our heart based on what we spend our time thinking about or consuming in the media. Over time, these harmful items can transform our outlook into a negative one and can cause us to act or speak in ways that aren't godly or loving. That's why we're called to guard our hearts against such things. So you need to be intentional about storing up healthy things in your heart.

By reading the Bible each day, we can be sure to maintain a healthy and life-giving soul which will flow out of us in every facet of our lives.

Don't let your fear of missing a deadline or being late to work stop you from making a daily connection with God first. Slow yourself down and read the Bible each day and watch how your life will change.



Circles of Friends

Close small group faith families forming friendships to support and encourage faith in each other's lives.

Small groups within a congregation provide support, encouragement, education and perceptions on life—perceptions in terms of the context of faith; perceptions that "put our reality into the perspective of God" (Pastor Busch, May 15, 2022).

Circles of Friends are groups of seven to eleven folks who meet together (they decide how often; suggested at least once a month) at the times that work best for the people in their group. They share food (dinner, breakfast, dessert, whatever the group decides), and share their lives and faith (they may just talk about life, have a Bible study, have a devotion, or however they as a group decide to talk about their faith in life). They may meet in their homes, at restaurants; it's up to their group and what works best for them. The result is a special group of friends growing in their faith life, and that growing faith life is reflected in their homes and church family as well.

Please prayerfully and seriously consider being part of this ministry. Join us Sunday, August 25, at 4:30 in the afternoon in the Fellowship Hall for our Loud Tables potluck, where we as the family of God at Zion meet together to share hospitality and our lives lived in faith. You will have the opportunity to join a *Circle of Friends* group that afternoon to connect with fellow Zion family and through them, develop a deeper relationship with God.

The *Loud Tables* potlucks are times of fellowship, sharing a meal, and talking about our faith in real life. Practicing hospitality and having spiritual conversations are two of the three activities found to be part of homes that are "spiritually vibrant"—where faith is alive and is reflected in the lives of the members of the household.

As is true for most things, if you want to grow stronger in certain activities you practice them.

Circles of Friends is another way to practice hospitality and sharing our real life faith stories with others as they share with us. A group of 7-11 folks meets together (they decide how often; suggested at least once a month) at the times that work best for the people in their group, shares food (dinner, breakfast, dessert, whatever the group decides), and shares faith (they may just talk about life, have a Bible study, have a devotion, or however they as a group decide to talk about their faith in their lives). They may meet in their homes, they may meet at restaurants; it's up to their group and what works best for them. The result is a special group of friends growing in their faith life, and that growing faith is reflected in their homes and church family as well.

Our next Loud Tables potluck is coming up, and there will be an opportunity to join new Circles of Friends groups. Please seriously consider blessing yourself, your household and your church family by participating in both!
