Correcting the Church "Judging Sin, Part 1"

INTRO: Having dealt with church **division** (ch. 1-4), Paul moves to the second area of concern, **disorders** (ch. 5-6). The first disorder he addressed was the refusal of the church to confront sin in its midst.

I.	Sin in the	church must be	(condemned
	& confronted) (5:1-5). As in Corinth, sexual sins present a constant threat to the purity of the church. Because Corinth had failed to confront the sinning member, Paul asserted his Apostolic authority and asked the church to carry out his sentence to expel the unrepentant sinner.		
II.	Churches	may be	to judge sin.
	There are many reasons that churches are reluctant to judge sin.

	This is NOT optional. Paul used the Feast of Unleavened Bread and		
	Passover to make his point. Christians are continually celebrating this		
	Feast because <u>Jesus IS our Passover Lamb</u> ; it is His sacrifice that		
	makes us unleavened (holy).
