Hope & Suffering
"No Shock or Shame; Popping Persecution Misconceptions"

INTRO: Some Christians hold false beliefs about persecution. In today's passage of study, Peter corrected them, turning his audience's trust to God. Christians suffer \_\_\_\_\_\_. Over 90,000 Christians lost T. their lives in 2016 because of their faith. Many more are imprisoned or incur lesser forms of persecution like job loss or discrimination.
