## 1 & 2 SAMUEL

"God's Monarch, Part 2: The Messianic Prototype"

**INTRO:** In last week's study, Saul was shown to be the Messianic Antitype. In today's study, God shows His people the Messianic **Prototype**, David.

- I. While God remains \_\_\_\_\_, His human \_\_\_\_\_ is accountable to \_\_\_\_\_. The glorified Jesus will return to reign as the Father's perfect Monarch in Jerusalem (Cf. Rev. 20:4-6).
- II. Human \_\_\_\_\_ proves incapable of *appreciating* what God ultimately desires in His \_\_\_\_\_ (16:1-17:58). *Man looks externally and clings to the conventional.*
- III. *Appreciate* what God \_\_\_\_\_\_ in his human \_\_\_\_\_ and *apply* the lessons to \_\_\_\_\_\_ Messiahship.

David exhibited the Messianic characteristics that God desires.

A.

From the initial appearance in the text, David is portrayed as a servant-shepherd. So is Jesus! (Cf. John 13:12-17).

**B.** 

David risked death for God's glory and the king's reward. Jesus obeyed the Father to death and endured suffering for the reward set before Him (Cf. Phil. 2:5-11; Hebrews 12:1-2).

C.

David used unconventional weaponry and strategy. Jesus came to establish a **spiritual** kingdom at His first coming. He will return and battle with Word of God (Rev. 19:11-16).
