## The Gospel According to Mark Follow the Leader

"A Death-honoring Sacrifice"

**INTRO:** Mark's Gospel marches its audience unflinchingly to the cross. In this scene, Jesus's death is again symbolically announced with a private pre-memorialization. How can we likewise honor Jesus' death?

- I. Jesus died as a \_\_\_\_\_\_ for \_\_\_\_ (14:1-2). The Messiah's sacrificial death was predicted in the OT (Isaiah 53:4-6) and proclaimed in the NT (Hebrews 10:10-14).
- II. Unbelievers dismiss Jesus' death as \_\_\_\_\_\_ (14:10-11). Jesus did NOT die as a martyr and/or to serve a moral lesson for His followers. His death served an eternal purpose!
- **III.** To honor Jesus' death... (14:3-9). Though we cannot replicate Mary's actions, we CAN honor His sacrifice.

A.

The BEST way to honor His death is to become a living sacrifice for His glory.

B.

Jesus called for His followers to remember His death by celebrating a transformed Passover meal in which He is the Lamb slain to protect from sin's curse.
