Mawuko Outreach supports children with disabilities

As part of its effort to support the less privileged in the country, Mawuko Outreach, a Non Governmental Organisation (NGO) has donated items to the Salvation Army Rehabilitation Centre (SARC) in Agona Duakwa in the Central Region.

The items, which included gallons of cooking oil, sanitary pads, bags of rice, biscuits, wheel chair blood pressure equipment and washing powder, were mainly to support children suffering from Cerebral Palsy Disease (CPD) at the Centre.

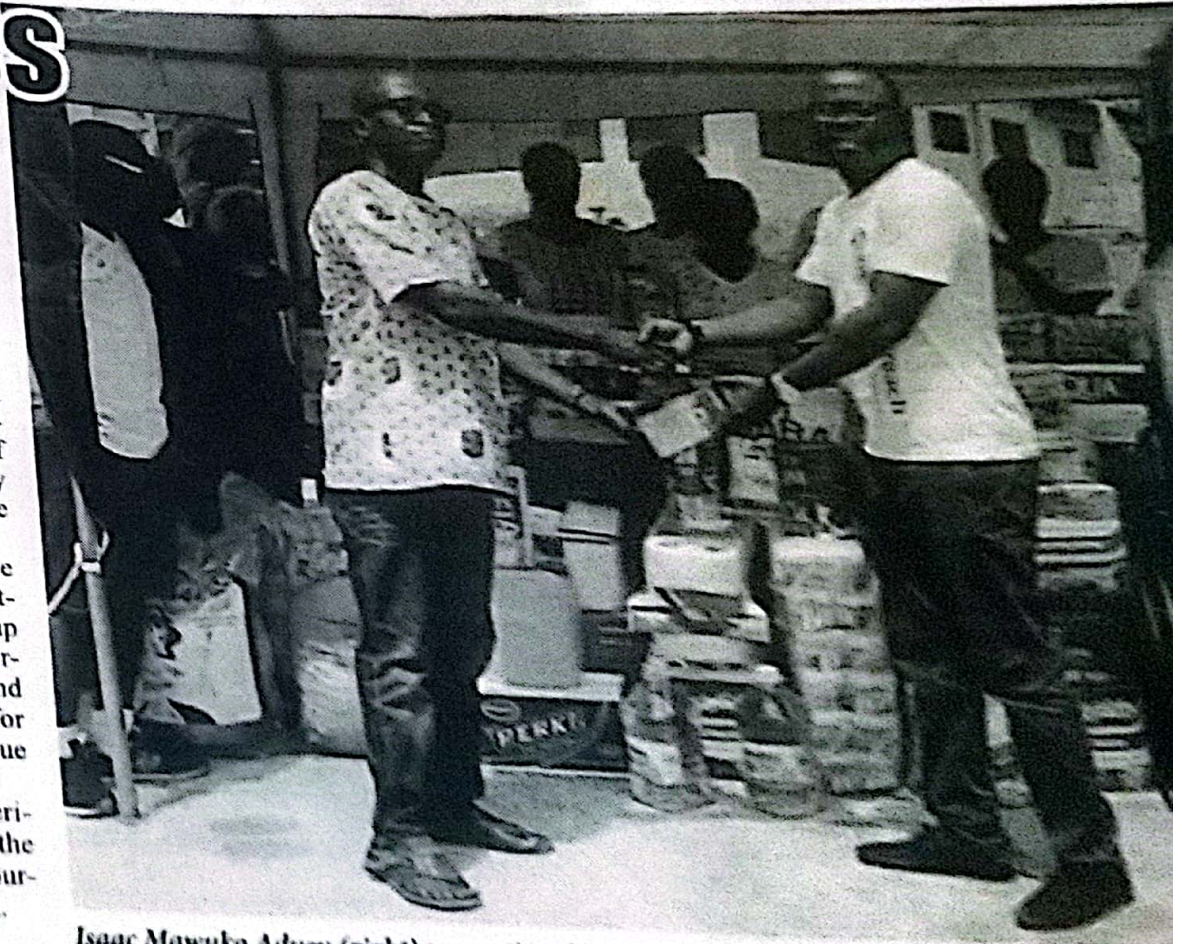
with a facility that brings together their target beneficiaries.
