- LW&T Issues Defined:
 - What is a Will: A document which provides the manner in which a person's property will be distributed after death.
 - Who May Make A Will: The maker of Will must be 18 years of age or older. Maker must be of sound mind and free from improper in influence, in Alabama.



- LW&T Issues Defined:
 - How is a Will Made:
 - 1. Must not be verbal, but written
 - 2. Must be signed
 - 3. Must be witnessed in a special manner provided by law
 - When Should You Make A Will: While the maker is in good health, free from emotional stress. Consider the guardianship of your children in case you and your spouse die - do you want to name the guardian or you want the court to appoint one.
