August, 2019 To Know Jesus Christ and Make Him Known to Others



Another summer is coming to a close, our youth are packing back-packs full of pencils, paper, books and rulers in preparation for the upcoming school year. Plans are being made for the many events that will be happening as the church begins its new year. Excitement is in the air for the promises that the future holds.

A few of our students may be feeling a litter trepidation with the coming of that new school year. These are the ones that are mov-

ing up in grades from elementary to secondary systems. Most of us can probably remember our first days in what was called back then "Junior High" and now carries the name "Middle School" where we went from having the same teacher for the entire day to trying to find our way through the maze of hallways — to several teachers waiting in different rooms. We did not understand it then, but this was preparing us for how it was going to be when we latter advance on to "High School" and then for some College.

As we walk our walk with God, each step along the way is preparing us for something in our future. From our earliest classes, where we learn concepts like sharing and caring, to later adult classes where we are reminded that God loves each of us the same. Each class added on to the knowledge about us as seen by God and our understanding about how we are to see each other.

Christianity has from the earliest teaching of Jesus in the book of Matthew taught that we would someday stand before the throne of Jesus:

All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate the people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. (Matt 25:32)

In this image, Jesus separate the sheep from the goats based upon the actions they did during their lives on earth. All of the actions can be traced to a lesson they had been told by parents, teachers and pastors. Many are surprised to find out that they were expected to do some of the things that they had been taught:

⁴¹ "Then he will say to those on his left, 'Depart from me, you who are cursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels.⁴² Fo For *I was hungry and you gave me nothing to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink,* ⁴³ *I was a stranger and you did not invite me in, I needed clothes and you did not clothe me, I was sick and in prison and you did not look after me.'* ⁴⁴ "They also will answer, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty

or a stranger or needing clothes or sick or in prison, and did not help you?' (Matt 25: 41 – 44)

And Jesus answers them: ⁴⁵ "He will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did not do for one of the least of these, you did not do for me.' (Matt 25: 45)

It is the very things we learned from our earliest days, to treat each other with the same love that God treats us. We also learn from this parable of Jesus that it is too easy to forget those teachings. We can put far too much need on our own personal desires and forget that we have been called to help those around us.

I always remind my son that he needs to remember all the things that he has learned, he will never know when he might need some of the knowledge in the future. We need to remember all the things that we learn at the feet of Jesus, you never know when some of it might come in handy. Praying for you as I hope that you are praying for me, Pastor Craig
