From the Pastor's Desk

As we begin the last couple of weeks of the Easter season, if we really are giving it the kind of deep and penetrating thought that it deserves, we start finding ourselves confronted by a group of questions that might make us feel slightly uncomfortable. At some point in the course of the Eastertide week we come into the presence of the cross of Jesus. During the rest of

the year we might have been able to find ways to skirt around the thought or conversation, but, at this time we almost cannot get away from the image of the cross. Even going to buy some amount of Easter candy for our children at the local Wal-Mart brings us face to face with chocolate crosses being sold there. Even the Sunday worship begins to revolve more closely around the cross as we use the palms from Palm Sunday and flowers brought to church on Easter in front of the church.

With all of this "Cross" imagery it should be expected that some of the conversation within the church would then be about the meaning of the cross. This is where we might begin our feeling of being uncomfortable as the questions start coming forward as to our understanding and belief about the cross and what it stands for. We are asked from the pulpit whether or not we believe in what the cross is supposed to do for us. Is the cross a source of power in our lives or not?

Through the readings of Holy Scriptures, the church announces that the cross is not just a source of the vilest sort of execution that the Romans had come up with, but also it is a powerful and transforming portal of God. The cross becomes the "door" through which God passes ALL of the gifts of God to His people. Mercy, Grace, Forgiveness, Salvation, Love and many more come to us through the cross. We are changed by the cross and become the "HOLY" people of God.

Therefore, part of Easter is to challenge us with the question, "Do we really see ourselves as the children of God; Holy, saved and sanctified?" Are we really the people that the Bible describes us to be or are we something other than that? More importantly, if we are just as the Bible describes us, then what is it that keeps us from fully taking hold of this and moving on in the light of God?

Over the course of the many years that I have been preaching from the pulpit, I have notice this strange occurrence in the lives of Christians, that while they were willing and able to except the concept of this power of the cross to bring upon them as an individual this sort of change, when it came to the notions of this change having some sort of power over them, they began to waver in their thoughts. This understanding also has promoted itself to others around them. They found themselves silently mocking the conversion and baptism of someone they knew or who are their family member.

Maybe this way of thought comes out of a vision of ourselves; we understand what type of people we truly are and then find ourselves unable to except any power, even from God, as being able to truly wipe away the damage and filth that we see in us. If God is unable to change us, then God must be unable to change those around us. However, when we really begin to see the power of the cross in our lives, the ability to forgive ourselves, then we begin to see the change in others' lives as well.

We as Christians see Easter as a time where God provided each and every one of us the wonderful ability to not only be able to forgive those who have hurt us in our lives, but also the ability to truly forgive ourselves for the things that we have done to others and ourselves. The cross that the world sees as only two pieces of old and broken wood, is the power of God to make each one of us something that we thought would be impossible to accomplished. Easter stands as a reminder to us that we are not only forgiven but we are made children of the Most High God. Easter reminds us that everything before is no longer as it was. We just need to take hold of the cross with outstretched arms and meet with the nail impaled hands of Jesus.

DEDICATION OF SLEEPING MATS HELD ON SUNDAY, MAY 19, 2019

During worship on Sunday morning a moving service was held to dedicate the Sleeping Mats made by our Bag Ladies group. This group consisting of men and women members of our congregation and ladies from outside Terrell, Kaufman, College Mound, Wills Point and Rockwall, has produced since last October, 27 sleeping mats and 11 pillows which will go to the homeless ministry in Dallas, "Our Calling." The total number the group has completed since its beginning is now 157 mats and 14 pillows. If you extrapolate this the group has taken 129,450 used plastic bags out of the waste stream and turned them into items that will bring comfort and warmth to people who have found themselves homeless. Our prayer is that the mats will also help them feel Gods love as it flows to them through us.



We pray God's blessing on the 21 Bag Ladies (men, women, and youth) who participated in the Dedication on Sunday.

27 sleeping mats and 11 pillows were dedicated to the glory of God on Sunday. We pray that God will bless the hands that worked to produce them and his children who will sleep on them.

CHURCH PARLOR PROJECT UPDATE



This settee is one of the pieces of furniture in the church parlor which is in bad need of recovering. The Upholsterer who has looked at our furniture recommended recovering this one because it is a very

good piece. Those of us who sit on it regularly recognize that it needs some loving care. The cost will be in the neighborhood of \$500 (includes our purchase of fabric plus labor). The piece has a special value in the parlor as it is small enough to be moved frequently as the room has to be rearranged for various functions. If you would like to help with this project checks should be made to First Christian with a "parlor project" notation. The CWF raised funds to purchase a needed couch and love seat but without some donations will have to wait another year to complete this project. Eventually we need to buy two chairs, replace end tables and lamps, have the seats of two chairs redone and clean or possibly replace the drapes.

The process of making the mats from used plastic bags to finished mat is very time consuming and challenging. Each step from saving the bags, to flattening the bags, to cutting the bags, to tying the strips, to rolling the balls of plarn, to crocheting has a right and wrong way. We appreciate so much all of the folks who are spending time helping with the project and would like to make sure the time is well spent.

At this workshop we will go over each step of the process and instruct in the right way of doing it. We like the old saying "Many hands make light work," but we don't want anyone spending their time doing work that isn't beneficial.

This will be a working event but we hope it will also be a fun one as we all learn a little more about how to make Sleeping Mats for the Homeless.
