

We hope you, our members, as well as guests, will take time to visit the Church History Room in the next few weeks. A display of our church's history was set up for the Community Church Tour held recently in celebration of the City's Sesquicentennial celebration. It will be left in place until after our celebration on Sunday, May 7th of 100 years of worship in this sanctuary. You will want to spend some time browsing, learning about our past, seeing photos of the church family through the years at work, worship, play and service.

Do you know what was happening in the country at the time our church history began? There is a timeline on the wall.

Have you ever wondered how many ministers we've had over our almost 150 years on this corner? We have photos of most of them.

Would you like to know who were members of the church in 1922? We have a collection of Church Directories, the first one dated that year.

Our Christian Women's Fellowship was active as early as 1934 and we have a collection of Yearbooks from 1934 to present.

You can read about important events in the life of our church from 1922 forward in the collection of newspapers that have been preserved, stories such as the installation of our Kimball Organ and the parade of citizens, marching bands and organizations who marched from downtown to celebrate the opening of the second sanctuary built on this site.
