#### Thanksgiving

FROM THE Pastor's Desk

During a sermon, I proposed to ask the question "What would you do if God sent you a bill for all the things He has given you, just like the electric bill, or the water bill?" Many of us, I believe, go through our lives completely taking for granted all of the gifts that are around us. We need to be able to take some time and reflect on all of the things that are in our lives that we receive. We need to be reminded that there are reasons to be thankful.

It sometimes is a shame that we only take one day a year to set aside for the

specific reason of giving thanks. This is in no way to diminish the importance of Thanksgiving Day and gathering around the table with our family and friends to give thanks, but should we not be thankful every day of our lives? Why does it take a special day on the calendar to remind us to be thankful?

With all of the events, and things we have in our life, it can be an easy process to overlook those things that remind us of the great gifts of God. We lock our car doors and roll up the windows tightly so that we can pretend not to see the homeless on the side of the street. We avoid hearing the cries of those who might not know where their next meal will be coming from. When we receive news about the destruction of the family of a relative or friend we slowly shake our heads and say "tisk, tisk."

It is only in those times in which problems raise up in our own lives, that we really begin to pay attention. The times when we are the ones being affected by the results of tests on our health, or when sudden tragedies' fall upon us with the loss of someone close to us; at those moments in our lives we are powerfully reminded how many good things we had prior to the onset of those troubling times.

In the Bible, Jesus tells the parable of a man who believed that he had all of the things he needed and could only look to the future with certainties. He tells the story in this way:

> <sup>16</sup> And He told them this parable: "The ground of a certain rich man yielded an abundant harvest. <sup>17</sup> He thought to himself, 'What shall I do? I have no place to store my crops.' <sup>18</sup> "Then he said, 'This is what I'll do. I will tear down my barns and build bigger ones, and there I will store my surplus grain. <sup>19</sup> And I'll say to myself, "You have plenty of grain laid up for many years. Take life easy; eat, drink and be merry." <sup>20</sup> "But God said to him, 'You fool! This very night your life will be demanded from you. Then who will get what you have prepared for your self?' "This is how it will be with whoever stores up things for themselves but is not rich toward God." - Luke 12: 16 – 21

As we come upon this year's Thanksgiving Day and we take time to gather around the table to eat the traditional dinner, let us also lift up our continuing thanks to God for all that God has given to us throughout our life. Let us each day give thanks!

One thing that might give your holiday a new twist would be to invite a member of the church that might not be having family or friends coming over this year. There might be a family who may not be able to have the traditional meal because of their current economic situation. You might invite them to your table.

Have a great Thanksgiving.

Shoebox Collection
Gets underway at FCC

#### **Dedication Sunday – November 17th**

It is again that time of year to begin planning your shoebox donations. Each shoebox, packed with small items for a child will be delivered by Samaritan's Purse to children around the world. Each box is an opportunity for a boy or girl to experience the love of God in a tangible way and to hear the Gospel. Each year the number of shoeboxes from our church has grown just as the number of shoeboxes collected worldwide has grown. To date over 100 million boys and girls in over 130 countries have experienced God's love through the power of a simple shoebox, including 50 of the most inaccessible countries in the world. Let's pay that God will bless our Shoebox Ministry this year.

#### Here is what you do:

- 1. Choose one of the flat, pre-printed shoeboxes and labels at the back of the Sanctuary on a Sunday or in the church office during the week. Or use an old shoebox and decorate it or buy a plastic shoebox.
- 2. The labels help you choose the age and sex of the child you pack for. Be sure to take one of the labels and tape it to the top of your box.
- 3. Read the list of suggested gift items for the various age groups.
- 4. Pack and bring the boxes back to the church for a dedication on Sunday, November 17<sup>th</sup>.
- 5. Put your name and address in the box along with a photo and a message of love.
- 6. Pray for the child who will receive your box.
- DON'T SEAL YOUR BOX. THEY ARE OPENED BEFORE SHIPPING TO ADD CHRISTIAN LITERATURE IN THE LANGUAGE OF THE CHILD WHO WILL RECEIVE IT (YOU MAY CLOSE IT WITH RUBBER BANDS.)
- DON'T PUT MONEY INSIDE THE BOX. WRITE A CHECK TO THE CHURCH FOR THE SHIPPING (\$9 PÉR BOX) WITH A "SHOEBOX" NOTATION.
- YOU CAN ALSO GO TO THE WEBSITE TO MAKE YOUR DONATION AND PRINT OUT A LABEL THAT WILL ALLOW YOU TO FOLLOW YOUR BOX TO ITS DESTINATION.

Big L pulled me aside this past Friday evening. He wanted to talk to me. We've known each other for the past three and a half years. He's known for drinking 32 ounce "soda pops." That's what he calls his beers around me.

Our friends at First Christian Church here in town were present and had a good number of their members in our room serving pulled pork sandwiches. They've been very active on The Block and know a number of people from the street by name. Big L was in the room with them and joined in the friendly and comfortable conversations that took place. It was when I walked in that he pulled me aside and said he wanted to talk.

Of course I said OK and we stepped outside. Big L stepped over to the bench donated by Faith Fellowship and sat down and I sat next to him.

He began, "I want you to know how much I love all of you. You guys have taken care of me like no one else ever has. When I got sick, you took me to the hospital. Do you remember that?"

"Of course I do."

"Well I remember too. I remember y'all buying me clothes while I was there so I could have something clean to wear. Remember?"

I nodded.

"Do you remember y'all coming to see me when I was in jail? And you put money on my commissary card?"

"Yes.

"Y'all have helped me when I needed rides to the doctor and to my cousin's house. Y'all feed me and let me stay here during the day."

"We're your friends."

"My family doesn't do nothing for me. I love y'all."

"I know. And we love you too."

"You don't know," he said with tears in his eyes, "nobody has ever loved me before."

"Jesus loves you and always has."

"Thank y'all for taking care of me," he said as tears rolled down his cheeks.

I sit amazed at the stirring I see in him as Christ moves within the heart of a friend who is truly a brother. A realization that there is a depth beyond relationship. It's kinship. As Christ is my brother, Big L is my brother. Christ bringing together two different people from different experiences and backgrounds into this marvelous bond of true family.

To steal an insight from Gregory Boyle from the song "O Holy Night":

"Long lay the world in sin and error pining

Till He appeared and the soul felt its worth."

Big L was made to face his value through the accepting embrace of brothers and sisters from First Christian Church and three and a half years of Heaven on earth from others. And a soul felt his worth.

Love requires that we get involved in the messy situations in people's lives.
