- Substance Use TIP - Vaping
- Cannot separate prevention of trauma, violence and substance abuse.
- TRY focuses on ACE's and resilience, violence prevention and substance use prevention.
- Every day among youth aged 10-24 - Nationally:
 - 12 are victims of homicide
 - 1374 are treated in emergency departments for injuries from physical assault
- 6 strategies to prevent youth violence from decades of research
 - Promote family environments that support healthy development
 - Provide quality education early in life
 - Strengthen youth's skills
 - Connect youth to caring adults and activities
 - Create protective community environments
 - Intervene to lessen harms and prevent future risk

- **Georgina Dukes/NC360CARES/community Engagement Director**
 - NC wants to ensure health of North Carolinians including the social factors of health.
 - On NC Health and Human Services website, information on Social Determinants of Health
 - Includes indicators.
 - Includes information on Medicaid changes
 - Can obtain real time reporting of outcomes, impact, performance and efficiency
 - Looks to determine whether individual was able to obtain the services they needed.
 - Everyone can participate in the services provided
 - First Coordinated Care service in nation.
 - Free to all agencies. No charge for them to be included in database.
 - Platform to send or receive referrals.
 - Has 31 types of services listed.
 - Either individuals or organizations can interact with the system.
 - Individual fills out profile and Coordinated Care Coordinator assists them with the resources that they need.
 - In Durham, agencies have 2 business days to respond to whether they can respond to the needs of a client.
 - Housing and transportation resources are included on website.

- Improved Efficiency in NC
- How to coordinate services within Durham
 - TRY provides gap funding for housing for families in Durham.
 - TRY can be a conduit to help keep track of needs of individuals and help others meet the needs of the individuals.
 - What are we doing in Durham and how can we support families that have needs?
 - How do we ask the questions and meet the needs of individuals?
 - Lakewood Elementary School was able to tap into community resources in order to assist the students. Can be model for other schools.
 - PACs can assist in collecting items needed.

- Good Neighbor Network
 - Works with alcohol outlets to help decrease the number of times that alcohol is being sold to underage customers
 - The more alcohol outlets there are in a community, the more crime there is.
