### "Give Thanks to God"

## A Season of Shifting



#### Scriptural Ref: Numbers 11

Difficult and uncomfortable as change is, God allows transitional phases to grow our faith, mature us and prepare us for greater blessings. The more willing we are to say yes to these transitional seasons and trust God through them, the more God can do for us.

There is something bigger and better God wants to do in our lives. That's why we're going through various changes. We're in a shifting season; and when we say yes to God as we walk through areas of doubt, distress, distraction, and dissatisfaction there's a major breakthrough we'll step into.

Moses went through transition, a season of shifting and <u>uncomfortability</u>. He did not want to be the one to deliver the children of Israel from Egyptian slavery. He argued with God so he wouldn't have to step into that role (Exodus 4). He felt unequipped for such a major assignment but couldn't get himself out of it. The Israelites made matters worse because they didn't adapt well to his leadership. They were disgruntled, inflexible, rebellious, and abusive to Moses.

I believe Moses was stressed. It wasn't like he had power to provide Israel with what they were accustomed to, and there certainly was no going back to Egypt! Israel did a poor job of adapting to the process God was using to create progress. They were resistant to change, they prolonged their time in the wilderness and went through a lot of unnecessary hardships.

God doesn't want that for you and neither do I!

I believe God is sending this word specifically to somebody who is uncomfortable and going through a season of shifting or a transitional moment. You don't have all the answers. You don't know how things will turn out, but you do have a promise from God, and a promise from God is all that's needed.

Despite the drought and/or wilderness today, you are headed toward a blessing. Shifting might not feel good, but great things are on the horizon. God is stretching you and challenging you. You can't grow weary through the process. Through the process growth occurs and growth happens when things become uncomfortable. You never will grow in an easy place! You will reap a harvest (Galatians 6:9) if you embrace your shifting season.

Accept the transition – even through the painful and uncomfortable moments. Pain and <u>uncomfortability</u> is preparing you for better and greater. Trust God through your dry places. Believe God has equipped you. Willingly give up what you are used to in exchange for the new and better thing God is doing. It is not easy, but it is necessary.

Some say, trust the process, but I say, trust the God of the process. God knows just what He is doing. There is no failure in Him. He knows how to make a way out of no way and miracles are his everyday business. I have seen Him do it for me many times, and He will do it for you. Just believe Him in your season of shifting!

#### Daily Reflections from the Desk of Our Ecumenical Patriarch

"And Moses made a serpent of brass, and put it upon a pole, and it came to pass, that if a serpent had bitten any man, when he beheld the serpent of brass, he lived." Numbers 21:9 "And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of man be lifted up: That whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have eternal life." John 3: 14-15

#### THE CURSE AND THE CURE

God many times uses that which may cause us defeat to be the means of our victory. Because of their testimony the three Hebrew youths were cast alive into a fiery furnace, but it was that same testimony that became the means of their overcoming the fiery furnace. Sin is a curse and a reproach, yet it is that same sin and curse that God uses to bring the cure. In other words, it is because of sin that we have a Savior, and because of the curse that we have a redeemer.

When Israel fell into sin in the wilderness, God sent serpents among them. Whosoever was bitten by one of those serpents died. Numbers 21:5-9 (6) *"And the LORD sent fiery serpents among the people, and they bit the people; and much people of Israel died."* The agent of death was the fiery serpent. These venomous serpents caused the death of many who had sinned by rebelling against God and his chosen leader, Moses. When Israel realized their sin, they desired that he pray to God that God would take away the fiery serpents from among them. We are not told that God "took away' the fiery serpents, but we are told that God told Moses to make a fiery serpent and put it upon a pole.

Anyone who was bitten by the fiery serpents, had only to look at the fiery serpent Moses had made and put on the pole, and that person would live. "And Moses made a serpent of brass, and put it upon a pole, and it came to pass, that if a serpent had bitten any man, when he beheld the serpent of brass, he lived." Numbers 21:9 The curse was death as a result of being bitten, but the cure was life as a result of looking at the serpent on the pole. The very thing, the fiery serpents that caused death, was used by God to bring about the cure.

John tells us that as Moses lifted up the serpent, made of Brass (resembling fire) on the pole, in the wilderness that Jesus was lifted up on the cross. All one bitten by that old serpent of sin, need to do is look to Jesus. He became as the fiery serpent, a curse, but God made him the CURE. "God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God." 2 Corinthians 5:21 God made the sinless become sin, so that the sinful could become sinless!


## News & Happenings from KCCM in Rock Hill, South Carolina

### Simon Says Walk by Faith from Crosswalk.com July 14, 2020 by Shawn McEvoy

Jesus said... "If anyone wishes to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow me." Matthew 16:24. You remember how to play Simon-Says, don't you? It's probably been a few years. It's the children's game where a leader gives verbal commands that are to be followed if and only if they are preceded by an explicit statement of permission bearing the warrant of mighty Simon himself. Non-"Simon-Says" commands are worthless, and following them only gets you in trouble. Aside from being fun (for a few minutes anyway), the game also helps kids work on motor skills, coordination, listening skills, manners, and respecting authority. I'm not convinced the game's so popular these days, as everyone's more interested in raising leaders than followers anymore, but I digress. Let's just look closely at the three actions in the verse above, which begins not with "Simon Says," but rather, "Then Jesus said..."

**1.Turn Around** (*"let him deny himself..."*). This is what denying one's self is all about. Repentance. Seeing things God's way. Going from darkness to light. Playing the fool for God. Even the notion of playing a child's game is apropos here, as we must not use our own adult human knowledge and wisdom to accomplish this step, but instead we die to self and come willingly in faith like a child.

**2. Bend Over, Stand Up** (*"take up his cross..."*). When you pick up the cross, you have to set down other burdens, the other things that you tend to think define you. Taking up your cross does not equal the burden of being you, your identity. You are indeed unique, but each day you should take on something new from Christ that makes you more like Him.

**3. Go Forward** ("...and follow Me"). Following = sacrificial living. It's advancement toward a Kingdom goal. In <u>Matthew 8:1</u> we find that when Jesus "had come down from the mountain, great multitudes followed Him." He had just finished teaching them; they had received instruction from one who had no place to lay his head and was feeding thousands on mere loaves and fishes. Moving forward in the Kingdom can only involve putting others in front of self. Is it really all that foreign to us? People sacrifice all the time to climb ladders in their career and for other personal goals. Why not sacrifice without the ladders?

**Intersecting Faith & Life:** Are these three instructions hard, or easy? The answer depends on perspective. Quitting smoking looks easy to the non-smoker, but the smoker must take it one minute, one day, one step at a time. Losing weight is a manageable goal for most, but if the focus is on losing 60 pounds in the first day the dieter is fighting a losing battle. Make it your goal to Turn Around, Bend Over/Stand Up, and Go Forward one day this week and see where playing "Jesus Said" takes you.



## **Recipes from around the Jurisdiction!**

#### **Shrimp Enchiladas**

1/2lb - 1lb. Shrimp
1/2 chopped onion
2 cloves garlic minced
1 jalapeño - seeded and chopped
1/4 tsp. Cumin
1/4 tsp. Chipotle chili powder
Shredded Monterrey Jack
Cilantro (for garnish)
8-10 Flour tortillas

Sauce: 2 cups heavy cream 2T butter 1/2 cup cheese 1/4 cup sour cream (I added a dash of seafood seasoning and added drippings from sautéed veggies and shrimp to give sauce more of a seafood flavor) Let simmer until cheese has melted. If sauce is too thin add a little flour until you have your desired consistency.

#### Directions:

Sauté onion, garlic, jalapeños Add seasonings and shrimp. Cook until shrimp are slightly pink.

Sprinkle cheese in bottom of each tortilla Spoon in shrimp mixture Roll tightly and Place in greased 9x13 pan Pour sauce over the top Sprinkle remaining cheese and garnish with fresh cilantro

Bake 350 Degrees for 15-30min.

1 tablespoon baking powder
half teaspoon salt
1/3 cup sugar if you want them sweet
add grated cheese or dried fruit or chopped chocolate or

Stir in 2 cups heavy whipping cream

Pat an inch thick on a baking sheet and brush the last bit of cream in the measuring cup on top. (This ratio is super easy to cut in half for a smaller batch)

Cut into wedges and bake at 425 degrees for 15 to 20 minutes, or until nicely golden
