We Have Come This Far by Faith

The title of this song truly sums up our journey through life, at least since becoming a child of God through faith in the finished work of our Lord Jesus. The words of the song seem to be even more so true, as we reflect upon where we have come since the COVID-19 coronavirus has been moving throughout the world with its devastating effects. If we may share two more lines from the song they would be, "leaning on the Lord" and "trusting in his Holy word." Obviously, "he's never failed me yet."

The keys to continuing to move by faith, are totally embodied in the words, "trusting in His Holy word." Jesus, our Lord and Savior reminds us in all three of the synoptic gospels (Matthew 24:35, Mark 13:31, and Luke 21:32) that *"heaven and* earth shall pass away, but my words shall not pass away." A Season of Shifting

Scriptural Ref: Numbers 11

Difficult and uncomfortable as change is, God allows transitional phases to grow our faith, mature us and prepare us for greater blessings. The more willing we are to say yes to these transitional seasons and trust God through them, the more God can do for us.

There is something bigger and better God wants to do in our lives. That is why we are going through various changes. We are in a shifting season; and when we say yes to God as we walk through areas of doubt, distress, distraction, and dissatisfaction there's a major breakthrough we will step into.

Moses went through transition, a season of shifting and <u>uncomfortability</u>. He did not want to be the one to deliver the children of Israel from Egyptian slavery. He argued with God so he would not have to step into that role (Exodus 4). He felt unequipped for such a major assignment but could not get himself out of it. The Israelites made matters worse because they did not adapt well to his leadership. They were disgruntled, inflexible, rebellious, and abusive to Moses.

I believe Moses was stressed. It was not like he had power to provide Israel with what they were accustomed to, and there certainly was no going back to Egypt! Israel did a poor job of adapting to the process God was using to create progress. They were resistant to change, they prolonged their time in the wilderness and went through a lot of unnecessary hardships.

God does not want that for you and neither do I!

I believe God is sending this word specifically to somebody who is uncomfortable and going through a season of shifting or a transitional moment. You do not have all the answers. You do not know how things will turn out, but you do have a promise from God, and a promise from God is all that's needed.

Despite the drought and/or wilderness today, you are headed toward a blessing. Shifting might not feel good, but great things are on the horizon. God is stretching you and challenging you. You cannot grow weary through the process. Through the process growth occurs and growth happens when things become uncomfortable. You never will grow in an easy place! You will reap a harvest (Galatians 6:9) if you embrace your shifting season.

Accept the transition – even through the painful and uncomfortable moments. Pain and <u>uncomfortability</u> is preparing you for better and greater. Trust God through your dry places. Believe God has equipped you. Willingly give up what you are used to in exchange for the new and better thing God is doing. It is not easy, but it is necessary.

Some say, trust the process, but I say, trust the God of the process. God knows just what He is doing. There is no failure in Him. He knows how to make a way out of no way and miracles are his everyday business. I have seen Him do it for me many times, and He will do it for you. Just believe Him in your season of shifting!

"MOVING FORWARD AND WALKING BY FAITH"

2 COR. 5:7 "FOR WE WALK BY FAITH NOT BY SIGHT OR APPEARANCE"

This Scripture is often quoted and is one of the most fundamental truths and statements that we as believers can make and live by. of the Bible. However, this scripture, while often quoted, is, for many, difficult to apply and actually live by. If we want to move forward by faith, it is essential that we walk by faith and not by sight. What this really means is that we are to walk by faith, not by our five physical senses (taste, touch, smell, hearing, and sight). The reason this is difficult to learn is because we have been trained for years to walk by natural human faith, and not the Godkind of faith.

We realize that natural human faith is still necessary in life. For example, in crossing a street, if we were to see a vehicle coming down the road, it would be essential for us to respond using our natural human faith and get out of the road immediately. If not, the outcome could be devastating or even fatal!!!! This illustrates that there are, indeed, many situations that occur in our daily lives that require us to respond with natural human faith. However true this may be, we must remember that in order to move forward by faith, in order to receive what God has for us, and in order to walk out what God has in store for us, we must learn to walk in the God-kind of faith—not by sight or what it looks like, but by faith!!

MATT. 6:25 "SO I TELL YOU, DON'T WORRY ABOUT EVERYDAY LIFE—WHETHER YOU HAVE ENOUGH FOOD, DRINK, AND CLOTHES. DOESN'T LIFE CONSIST OF MORE THAN FOOD AND CLOTHING?"

Jesus Himself declared here in Matthew chapter 6 that we are not to worry about everyday life. Worry is an indicator of indicator of whether we are walking by faith or whether we are walking by sight. We know this is true because worry and faith are not compatible, and they cannot co-exist. Worry means to *be anxious or troubled with the cares* of this life. When we worry, what we are doing is putting our focus and attention on what is happening in the natural. But when we walk by faith, we are able to move forward by faith, thus dispelling and dismissing worry from our lives.

Faith does not speak of things as though they will one day come to pass. Faith brings what one hopes for into the "now". So, in order to be able to walk by faith and not by sight, we need to have a renewed mind, ushering in a transition in the way we think and in what we see. We no longer see in the natural, but we see with the eyes of faith. We no longer consider circumstances over God's word and His promises.

HEB. 11:1 "NOW FAITH IS THE ASSURANCE (THE CONFIRMATION, THE TITLE DEED) OF THE THINGS [WE] HOPE FOR, BEING THE PROOF OF THINGS [WE] DO NOT SEE AND THE CONVICTION OF THEIR REALITY [FAITH PERCEIVING AS REAL FACT WHAT IS NOT REVEALED TO THE SENSES]"

We must know and understand that faith is the proof of what we hope for. Our hope begins in what God has promised, but through faith, that hope is changed into a present reality before it is ever seen or realized.

So, dear brothers and sisters, let us as move forward by faith by making sure we are walking by faith, standing on God's promises, knowing that what He has promised will come to pass in our lives. God cannot lie! Take Him at His word!!!

Why Is the Apostles' Creed Important?

The **Apostles' Creed**, like the Nicene **Creed**, is widely accepted as a statement of faith among Western Christian churches (both Roman Catholic and Protestant) and used by many of Christian denominations as a part of worship services.

The Nicene Creed is a statement of belief widely used in Christian liturgy. It is called Nicene because it was originally adopted in the city of Nicaea by the First Council of Nicaea in 325. In 381, it was amended at the First Council of Constantinople, and the amended form is referred to as the Nicene or the Niceno-Constantinopolitan Creed.

It is the simplest of all the creeds. This creed is called the Apostles' Creed not because it was produced by the apostles themselves but because it contains a brief summary of their teachings. It sets forth their doctrine "in sublime simplicity, in unsurpassable brevity, in beautiful order, and with liturgical solemnity."

In its present form it is dated no later than the fourth century. More than any other Christian creed, it may justly be called an ecumenical symbol of faith. This translation of the Latin text was approved by the CRC Synod of 1988.

The Apostles' Creed is the most well-known summary statement of what orthodox Christians hold to be true. It reminds of us central points about which all Christians must agree, serves as a **defense against heresies or false teachings which deny any element, summarizes the faith**, and provides an important resource for either private or corporate statements of Christian faith.

From the Archives of Bishop Tindal's Daily Reflections-A Word From The Word

"Then said he, Lo, I come to do thy will, O God. He taketh away the first, that he may establish the second. By the which will we are sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all." Hebrews 10:8-9 (KJV).

The First is no more.

It is to no avail to seek to be justified by God through any other means than the way that was made by the Lord Jesus on the cross. The way of appeasing the justice of a just God through the keeping of the Law of Moses is no longer what God requires. In fact, the purpose of the Law of Moses was really to show mankind that through the works of the Law, no person may be justified in God's sight. All 619 tenets of the Law had to be observed and kept for an individual to be justified and "right" with God. This was an impossible task. The word says in James, *"For whosoever shall keep the whole law, and yet offend in one point, he is guilty of all."* James 2:10 (KJV) The Law was a mirror through which sinful man would be able to see his inadequacy to be saved through his attempts to observe the law. Lemony Turkey Rice Soup

- 2 cups diced cooked turkey
- 2 cups cooked long grain rice
- 1 can (10-3/4 ounces) condensed cream of chicken soup, undiluted
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 6 cups chicken broth, divided
- 2 tablespoons cornstarch
- 1/4 to 1/3 cup lemon juice
- 1/4 to 1/2 cup minced fresh cilantro

Directions

- In a large saucepan, combine first 4 ingredients and 5-1/2 cups broth. Bring to a boil; cook 3 minutes.
- In a small bowl, mix cornstarch and remaining broth until smooth; gradually stir into soup. Bring to a boil; cook and stir until thickened, 1-2 minutes. Remove from heat; stir in lemon juice and cilantro.

Classic Beef Strew

- 2 pounds beef stew meat, cut
- into 1-inch cubes
- 1 to 2 tablespoons canola oil
- 1-1/2 cups chopped onions
- 1 can (14-1/2 ounces) diced tomatoes, undrained
- 1 can (10-1/2 ounces) condensed beef broth, undiluted
- 3 tablespoons quick-cooking tapioca
- 1 garlic clove, minced
- 1 tablespoon dried parsley flakes
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1 bay leaf
- 6 medium carrots, cut into 2-inch pieces
- 3 medium potatoes, peeled and cut into 2-inch pieces
- 1 cup sliced celery (1-inch lengths)

Directions

In an oven-safe Dutch oven, brown beef in batches in oil; drain. Return all meat to the pan. Add onions, tomatoes, broth, tapioca, garlic, parsley, salt, pepper, and bay leaf. Bring to a boil.

Cover stew and bake at 350° for 1 hour. Stir in carrots, potatoes, and celery. Bake, covered, 1 hour longer or until meat and vegetables are tender. Discard bay leaf.
