PROPOSAL * SYNOPSIS * SYLLABUS

OUTLINE:

Purpose:

God's word clearly places emphasis upon preparation for effective ministry. "*That ye* might walk worthy of the Lord unto all pleasing, being fruitful in every good work, and increasing in the knowledge of God;" (Colossians 1:10) The Apostle Paul spent time in Arabia, (Galations1:15-18) possibly at the feet of the Lord Jesus, studying in "The School of the Spirit," before he conferred with any of the Apostles. He reminds all in the faith to, "*Study to shew* thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth." (2 Timothy 2:15) We are compelled to prepare, realizing, "My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge:" (Hosea 4:6)

The Holy Spirit (Ruach HaKodesh) has placed in my mind to continue in the Series, Ministerial Enlightenment Course, Lessons on the Feast of Israel. These lessons will introduce to some, and refresh the knowledge of others. It is our prayer that all who undertake the study of these lessons will be not only enlightened , but tremendously blessed. Information will be shared about the Feast of Israel, their application to one's personal life, their underlying prophetic messages and how the timeline of God's promises may be understood through the study of these feast. From this study the solution to certain "Biblical mysteries" mentioned in the Scriptures will be revealed. Hebrew words and phrases will be introduced along with some contemporary customs, and ancient traditions of God's chosen people. How those customs and traditions developed and why they are yet practiced will be included in these lessons. Our rationale in presenting these lessons, is foremost in obedience to a clear leading of the Rauch HaKodesh and to partake in equipping ministers and other church leaders with the knowledge of how to be more effective in their calling as they pursue excellence in ministry as a prime goal in life.

Objective:

The objective of the Ministerial Training Course is twofold. First and foremost, it is being presented to be a source of enlightenment to all who desire to increase their knowledge of the Feasts of Israel and the application of these feasts to the church. Second this course is being presented as a continuing education course towards the Bachelor of Theology or Undergraduate Degree in Biblical Studies in the UFCCM Bible College. The UFCCM Bible College is an Accredited Institution in the UFCCM, that is designed to offer Certificates of Completion and/or degrees to those who would like to further their Biblical knowledge and skills in preparation for effective leadership roles in God's work of Kingdom building.

Duration of Course and Frequency of Lessons

- 10-12 lessons over 10-12-week period.
- Course will begin Monday February 1, 2021 at 8:00 PM/EST and Final class Monday April 19, 2021. All classes will begin at 8:00 PM/EST.
- Each lesson will be approximately 25 to 30 minutes lecture plus 20-30minute Q & A session at conclusion of each lesson.
- There will be a "Course Break" March 29th to April 12th. Students are encouraged to complete expected course work during this time. Course will resume April 12th, and 19th.
- Term paper will be due by April 12th.
- Final exam will be distributed on April 12th, and due in our office by April 15th.
- All lessons will be presented in digital format over Zoom App. (all students may log into <u>www.zoom.com</u> for free video conference lecture). If you do not have the Zoom app, please download onto your computer or tablet or phone to participate. If there are any questions, please text our office at <u>443-415-7521</u> by December 21, 2020.
- Students will need digital device such as computer, iPad, phone, etc., to access lessons and return exams, quizzes, term papers etc. Materials issued by instructor may be printed and copied by student.

Responsibilities of Students to receive certificate

- All students are expected to attend all classes at the scheduled time. Only one excused absence is allowed. Students are asked to notify the instructor by text message if they are unable to attend a scheduled lesson. The student may review missed lesson with permission of instructor via pre-recorded lesson.
- Honor System:
 - All students are expected to honor the following personal honor system.
 - No books, notes, or other material may be used when taking the quizzes or examinations.
 - The two exams and three quizzes will be given using the personal honor system.
 - Quizzes will be issued at the close of lesson and must be completed and returned to instructor within 24 hours of being issued.

- Exams will be issued at close of lesson and must be completed and returned to instructor within 3 days of being issued.
- The student may use his/her notes when taking the Final Exam.
- One point will be deducted from quizzes or exams for each day late.
- To successfully pass the course, the student must accumulate a total of 75 points (C), and meet all other requirements.
- The course will consist of three quizzes, two Exams, one Term Paper and the Final Exam.
- Quizzes will be unannounced and will be worth 5 points each.
- Each exam will be worth 20 points
- Final exam will be worth 25 points
- The Term Paper will be worth 20 points
- The required Term Paper will consist of 4-6 pages exclusive of references.
- Term Paper may be on <u>any topic presented during course with</u> <u>approval of Instructor.</u> (Student must request approval from Instructor, for subject of Term Paper).
- Paper must be double spaced-Times New Roman, Font 12.
- Term Paper may be submitted electronically.
- All fees must be current, before Paper will be graded.

Monetary Responsibility of Students

- Enrollment fee is \$75.00/student. (Fee for married couples is \$100.00 for both)
- Fee Includes:
 - Cost for Grading exams
 - Cost for Grading Essay
 - Cost for preparation and Mailing of Certificate of Completion
- Student is responsible for all required Bibles, other Literature, notebooks etc., recommended by teacher. All suggested literature is available online and there is usually no cost (Student must have Bible, KJV OR NLT version).
- *Payment in Full required before enrollment in course will be official.
