Amendment to the original Outline, Synopsis, and Syllabus and of Ministerial Enlightenment Course: UFCCM Bible College:

This course has been successfully presented to an initial class of 10 students of different levels of ministry who all reported that they deeply benefited from the course. Since we are now preparing to present this course to a broader range of students from various levels of ministerial training and experience, we have made some changes to the original version of the course. As a result, while the content of information presented in this course has not changed, it has been modified and expanded to be more inclusive of the basic skills and practical information which we believe is necessary for success in ministry.

Purpose:

God's word clearly places emphasis upon preparation for effective ministry. Objective:

The objective of the Ministerial Training Course is twofold. Responsibilities of Students to receive certificate

• All students are expected to attend all classes at the scheduled time. Only one excused absence is allowed. Students are asked to notify the instructor by text message if they are unable to attend a scheduled lesson. The student may review missed lesson with permission of instructor via pre-recorded lesson.

- The term paper will constitute 20% of Grade average.
- The required Term Paper must consist of a 500 word (double spaced-Times New Roman, Font 12) typed paper on <u>any subject presented</u> <u>during course with approval of the Instructor.</u>
- Final grade will not be released until the Term Paper has been submitted and graded.
- Term Paper must be submitted by Monday January 11th, 2022.
