What an honor and a privilege it is to share with you some of the wonderful and exciting things happening within the UFCCM. We would like to thank our Ecumenical Patriarch and the entire Broad of Bishops for their ongoing support and encouragement in this endeavor. In a time when there are so many negative reports transmitted every day throughout our world, it is so refreshing and uplifting to share wonderful, inspirational, and positive things that our Lord has allowed us to experience.

We know that these are challenging times for many, and the spirit of fear, anger, and discouragement has manifested itself and try to overtake us as we witness the many atrocities going on around us in our world. We have witnessed many of the things that Jesus foretold in His Word.

In Matthew's Gospel chapter 24, Jesus warns that nation shall rise up against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. That there would be wars and rumors of wars. He let us know that there would be famine in the lands, that men would be willing to believe a lie, before they would accept the truth (II Thessalonians 2:9-17). We see these things happening in our world today. We have heard some say that "I do not know what to pray for or I do not know how to pray". He will never fail us- the Lord is consistent in dealing with His saints. The Psalmist reminds us in Psalms 121:1-2 that: "I will lift up mine eyes unto the hills, from whence cometh my help. My help cometh from the Lord, which made heaven and earth." There is no better assurance than knowing that the Lord is there to cover his children!

We challenge and encourage you to set aside a time during your day to pray earnestly and petition the throne of God as His Holy Spirit leads you. ECUMENICAL PATRIARCH'S Words of Encouragement



Isaiah 40:6 The voice said, Cry, and he said, What shall I cry?

John: 3:15, 23 John bare witness of him, and cried, saying, This was he of whom I spake... 23: ... I am the voice of one crying in the wilderness, Make straight the way of the Lord..."

WHAT SHALL I CRY?

Whenever I get up to preach at First Church, in Baltimore, Maryland where my son Overseer Tindal, Jr is the very fine pastor, he always ask the congregation to point their right hand towards me and say, "preach preacher preach." I believe that this act is an indication from the pastor that the church is not at all concerned about what "I" have to say, but what the Lord has to say through me. Every time a "spokesperson" for the Lord presumes to publicly speak he/she should first ask of the Lord, "What shall I cry?" I have used the phraseology of the above texts in which the word "cry," "cried" and "crying" is used, but the idea is to hear from the Lord before the people hear from you!

The pulpit is not the place to make excuses about not feeling well, or I do not know what the Lord has for you today, or any other excuses. As a "spokesperson" for the Lord you may speak as a preacher, a prophet, an evangelist, an apostle, a pastor or teacher, or any other type of spokesperson, but always seek the Lord, and preach the pure unadulterated word of the Lord. The apostle Peter said 1st Peter 3:15 "*But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts: and be ready always to give an answer to every man that asketh you a reason of the hope that is in you with meekness and fear..."* Your task is not to save anyone, but to tell everyone you can about someone who can save anyone.

The Word of the Lord is sufficient to draw anyone to saving faith in Christ. Jesus said in John 12:32 "*And I, if I be lifted up from the earth, will draw all men unto me.*" He referred here, to the manner of his death, but our words should lift up his suffering, death, and subsequent victorious resurrection as the price that he paid for our salvation. The Word clearly says John 6:44,

"No one can come to me unless the father who sent me draws them. And I will raise them up at

the last day." People come to the Lord, and receive salvation and the multitude of blessings that accompany "sonship or citizenship" in the Kingdom of the Lord through the words that you say as representatives/witnesses (Paul calls us Christ's ambassadors 2 Corinthians 5:20) of Jesus.

What shall I cry?

Remember that people come to Christ as the Holy Spirit brings them into conviction and saving faith, by the words given to you by the Lord. Cry out, or from the Hebrew translation of the initial passage above Isaiah 40:6, "call out, proclaim, read the whole, all" the truth of the Word. Even though we are not finished these thoughts, (I am delivering unto you what the Lord has given unto me,) we will end these thoughts with a passage from the Scriptures.

Romans10:14-17 NLV

How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them? And how can anyone preach unless they are sent? As it is written: "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news But not all the Israelites accepted the good news. For Isaiah says, "Lord, who has believed our message?

Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word about Christ.

Note: Gill's Exposition of the Entire Bible

The Lord's voice to the prophet, or rather to any and every Gospel minister, giving them an order to prophesy and preach, without which they cannot preach regularly and lawfully; it is the same as, "go, teach all nations", &c. preach the Gospel to every creature, &c. <u>Matthew 28:19</u>, and he said, what shall I cry? publish, proclaim, or preach? For a minister of the Gospel is to preach not out of his own heart, or of his own head, or what is of his own devising and framing, but what is agreeable to the mind of Christ, as revealed in his word; he is to speak according to the oracles of God, the proportion and analogy of faith; he is to inquire there, and of Christ, what he shall say.




My name is Seiji Thompson, and I am the Lead Pastor of Gods People International Church!!
