SUMMARY:



CHARACTERS: Mike and Elaine - Bible fans

Mike and Elaine enter.

MIKE: Hey guys, I'm Mike.

ELAINE: And I'm Elaine.

MIKE: And we are Bible fanatics!


ELAINE: And now that you guys know the whole Bible, you can be too!

MIKE: The Bible is the Word of God. It tells us how God created the world and us. And it tells us how God made a plan to save us from sin.

ELAINE: The Bible teaches us many things. Who Jesus was. Why Jesus came to Earth. How we can live in a way that honors God and shows other people that Jesus loves them.

MIKE: And most importantly, it shows us the way to get to Heaven.

ELAINE: Now, let's be honest, memorizing the books of the Bible like you have isn't going to help us get to Heaven just by itself. But knowing the books of the Bible will help you become a smarter student of the Bible. You can find Bible stories quicker. You will know what each section of the Bible teaches. And you'll be better able to search and find the answers you need when you need them.





MIKE: We hope all of you will dig deeper into the Scriptures. We want you to know what the Bible says and what it means for your life.

ELAINE: This is the last time we'll get to visit with you guys about the Bible, but one more time, let's see what we've learned. Can you guys go through all 66 books with us, names and hand motions?

MIKE: I bet they can!

ELAINE: Let's do it!

Mike and Elaine will work together to lead the kids through ALL the books of the Bible:

Genesis - Circle hands Exodus - Open hands as if parting the sea Leviticus - Fist on forehead to represent the law on our minds Numbers - Counting to 3 on fingers Deuteronomy - Two fingers in a peace sign Joshua - Drop hands like the walls of Jericho falling down Judges - Pound a fist into the other hand like a judge's gavel Ruth - Bend down and pick up a piece of wheat 1 & 2 Samuel - Count on your fingers 1 and 2, then make an S with one finger in the air 1 & 2 Kings - Count on your fingers 1 and 2, then put both hands on your head like you're putting on a crown 1 & 2 Chronicles - Count on your fingers 1 and 2, then make a C shape with your hand Ezra - Wave goodbye as if leaving exile to go home Nehemiah - Stack one hand on the other as if stacking bricks and building a wall Esther - Pretend you are placing a crown on your head Job - Scratch your arm Psalms - Lift a hand in praise Proverbs - Point like a teacher Ecclesiastes - Shrug, because it's all meaningless Song of Solomon - Put a "wedding ring" on your finger Isaiah - Draw a lower case "I" in the air and dot the I Jeremiah - Cry with one eye Lamentations - Cry with both eyes Ezekiel - Draw a "Z" in the air Daniel - Cover your mouth like God closed the lions' mouths Hosea - Hands up on either side of the head like the legs of an H Joel - Draw a J in the air Amos - Hands up in a peak like an A Obadiah - Hands over head in a circle like an O Jonah - Hands like fish gills on the side of your face



Micah - Rock a baby in your arms because Micah said where Jesus would be born Nahum - Hold your nose to make the N sound in Nahum Habakkuk - Stir a pot in front of you like you're cooking for HabakKUK Zephaniah - Make a Z with your arms (as if walking like an Egyptian) to the left Haggai - Make a circle around your eye for Hagg-eye Zechariah - Make a Z with your arms but pointed to the right Malachi - Point to Heaven because Malachi taught us the Messiah is coming! Matthew - Make a big M with two hands Mark - Make a small M with 3 fingers on one hand Luke - Make an L with the thumb and index finger of one hand John - Make a W to remember, "In the beginning was the Word..." Acts (of the church or the Holy Spirit) - Swing a pretend axe with your hands Romans - Salute 1 & 2 Corinthians - Count 1 and 2 on fingers, then make a big C as in YMCA Galatians - Turn the big C into a G by bending in the lower arm Ephesians - Hold 3 fingers sideways in an E shape Philippians - Flip your hand from palm up to palm down Colossians - Drive a car to avoid a collision 1 & 2 Thessalonians - Count 1 and 2 fingers, then make a T with your hands, left hand on top 1 & 2 Timothy - Count 1 and 2 fingers, then make a T with your hands, right hand on top Titus - Pretend to tie a knot in the air with your fingers Philemon - Break your hands apart as if breaking chains free from your wrists Hebrews - Pretend to sip "brewed" coffee from a cup James - Point to your tongue 1 & 2 Peter - Count 1 and 2 with your fingers, then throw your fishing line 1, 2, and 3 John - Count 1, 2, 3 fingers Jude - Hold two fingers up (thumb and index) to show Jude is a short book Revelation - Hold your hands over your eyes like a pair of binoculars After going through the books, end with this: ELAINE: Great job you guys! We're so proud of you. MIKE: Keep reciting those books, and start reading them. They will change your life! ELAINE: And make you a Bible fanatic too! So long!

OBJECT LESSON OR KIDS SERMON

Items needed:

Addition and Multiplication flash cards

Begin this lesson by going through a few flash cards. Use the addition cards for younger kids, and use the multiplication cards for older kids.

One of the first things you learned in math wasn't how to figure out problems. The first thing you did was memorize. You memorized simple facts like these: 2 plus 2, 2 minus 1, 2 times 2, 2 divided by 2. These math facts may have seemed boring, but they were the foundation for learning math. Knowing two plus two and two minus two is the beginning to understanding everything from algebra to geometry and even calculus. It all starts with flashcards and memorization.

Memorizing the Bible isn't going to get you into Heaven, but like these flashcards, knowing the books of the Bible will make you a better student of the Bible. You all know where to find every book in the Old Testament. You know where to find the stories of creation, the stories of ancient Israel, the poetry of King David, and the stories of Jesus. And knowing that will help you learn what the Bible has to say.

The Bible is the road map to Heaven. It teaches us how God made a plan to save us and how we can live forever with Jesus. Knowing the books of the Bible will help you to discover all God has to teach you about knowing Jesus and living a godly life.

Get to know the books of the Bible. Discover the road to Heaven, and you will never go astray!



LARGE GROUP GAME

NEED FOR SPEED

ITEMS NEEDED: None

INSTRUCTIONS:

Pick three kids who think they know the books of the Bible really, really well. Have each kid recite the books of the Bible as quickly as they can, one at a time, and time them. The kid with the fastest time who does not miss a book wins.

LARGE GROUP LESSON

BOTTOM LINE:

The Bible teaches us how we can be saved from sin.

OBJECTIVE:

Kids will be able to say all 66 Books of the Bible.

KEY PASSAGE:

Philippians 2:1-11, Having the Mind of Christ

INTRO:

How many of you were here when we started this series? How many of you have not missed a single week of this Books of the Bible series? How many of you have worked hard not just on Sundays, but also during the week to learn the books of the Bible?

How many of you thought there was no way in the world you could possibly learn those 66 books?

We believed in you, right from the start. Do you know why? Because kids your age have an amazing capacity for learning and memorizing. Think of some of the things you've memorized in your life already. Raise your hand if you know your address? Your mom and dad's phone numbers? The Pledge of Allegiance? Who knows their math facts in addition and subtraction? What about multiplication? Who has memorized all 50 states in the United States? Who knows the words to Jingle Bells? Silent Night? Jesus Loves Me? Who here already knows John 3:16?

When you think of all the things you've already memorized, learning the 66 books of the Bible wasn't that tough. It's a piece of cake! Even if you haven't learned them yet, we want to encourage you to keep studying them. You will get it, and you will be blessed for knowing them.

Of course, knowing the names of the books of the Bible isn't nearly as important as knowing what those books say. Knowing the books by name and where to find them will, however, help you be a better student of the Bible. The more you read them, the better you'll know what the Bible has to say. The Bible is a road map that shows us the way to Heaven, and it teaches us that there is only one way to get there. Paul summed up the Bible's message very well in his letter to the Philippians.



LARGE GROUP LESSON

READ PHILIPPIANS 2:1-11

MAIN POINT:

God sent his son Jesus to save us from our sins. Jesus was willing to humble himself, to become human, and to die in our place so that we could go to Heaven. If we believe in Jesus as our Savior, God will set us on the road to Heaven.

Following Jesus means that we, like Jesus, should humble ourselves. We need to think of others before our own needs, and we need to love like Jesus loved. We need to turn away from sin and obey God so that people can see Jesus in us.

The Bible is a road map to Heaven. It points us to Jesus, and it shows us the way we need to travel to get to Him. If we follow Jesus and obey him, not only will we get to Heaven, but other people will see Jesus in us and follow after Him.

The Bible is the greatest book ever written. It's the story of a God who loves us and the way he chose to save us.

DRIVE IT HOME:

The Bible begins at the beginning of time with the story of Creation and the fall of man. Through the first five books of the Bible, we learn that God loves us in spite of our sin. We see God choosing a special people through whom he would save the world.

The books of history continue the story of God's chosen people. We see how God blesses those who are faithful, and how he corrects them when they need it.

The poetry books are full of praise to our God and the wisdom of some of Israel's wisest leaders.

The prophets, major and minor, brought messages to God's people that still speak to us today. They talk of God's love, of God's anger with sin, and God's forgiveness. And they talk about the coming of Jesus.

The Gospels are the story of Jesus, told from four different viewpoints so we can get a complete picture of who Jesus is. Acts tells the story of the early church founded by Jesus' followers.

The letters of Paul, written to the churches and to his friends, help us to stay focused on Jesus and united in spirit. The remaining letters remind us that Jesus is the only way to be saved and urge us to live godly lives.

And then comes Revelation, one last book of prophecy that tells us how one day, Jesus will return.

LARGE GROUP LESSON

He will judge the world, and all who believe in Jesus will go to be with him in a New Heaven and a New Earth.

The Bible starts with Creation and a fall. It ends with a new Creation that will never end. It ends with a promise we can all one day be with Jesus. I hope all of you will get to know your Bibles. Don't stop with knowing the books by name. Get to know what each book says. Each book has a special purpose, but they all fit together for one greater purpose. The Bible is God's way of pointing us all to Jesus and to Heaven!




III PARENT TIME:
