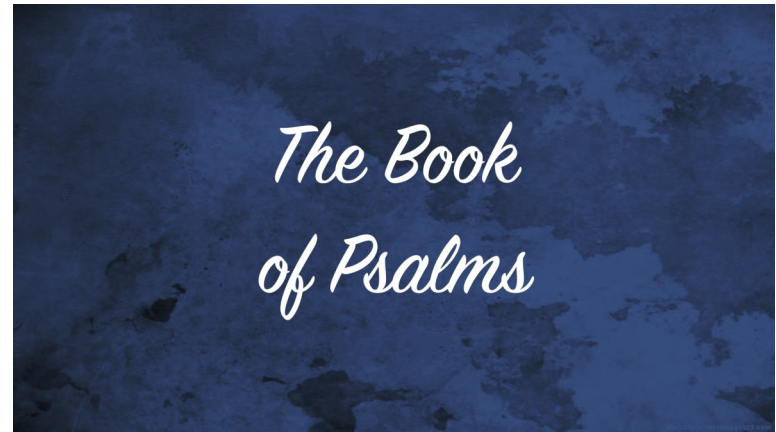


Psalm 37:7 tells us to wait patiently for God to act. Is this easy for you or difficult? How can we develop a greater depth of patience?
