Hermeneutic Principles

What did it mean then? We can gain insight through considering the following:

<u>Historical issues</u>: What was the situation at the time of writing?

<u>Grammatical issues</u>: What does it actually say?

<u>Contextual issues</u>: What do we learn from the surrounding verses and chapters?

<u>Literary Issues</u>: What genre of literature is it? (narrative, poetry, history etc.)

Timeless Principles. What principles can be extracted that have a broader application than that specific time and place?

Tools:

<u>Scripture interprets scripture</u>—what can we learn from related passages, understanding that God does not change; what he says will always be consistent.

Reason—Think it through

<u>Tradition</u>—What has the church historically thought <u>Experience</u>—How have you personally seen timeless principles in real life?

<u>Emotion</u>-Be careful with this one, it can be misleading, but what do you feel about the passage?

How does it apply to my life? How should the timeless principle impact how you think and live in your daily life?


