- 55% Unemployed and Seeking
 - 70% of residents stated specifically they engaged with the CIL ROSS program to Come-Up because they were tired of being broke and struggling to pay their bills.
- The highest 25% stated they were tired of taking 2 steps forward, only to be pushed 5 steps backwards.
- 30% stated they feel depressed and not motivated at times
- 70% stated they never feel Depressed
