Greetings Church!

As we move into June we will also be moving from the Easter Season to Pentecost and the Sundays of "Ordinary Time". We have been looking at the stories of the early church from the book of Acts – which will finish with the celebration of the Day of Pentecost remembering the very visible presence of the Holy Spirit giving life (and a push) to Jesus' disciples – sending them into the world to share God's good news. Worship Scripture Texts for June: finishing the Series on Acts

June 1 – 7<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter – Psalm 97; Acts 16:16-34 Paul and Silas in prison

June 8 – The Day of Pentecost – Psalm 104; Acts 2:1-21

June 15 – Trinity Sunday – and beyond -

During the summer months we would like to encourage interested persons to volunteer for several openings and to receive the training in a more relaxed These positions are open for Men and Women and require no specialized or additional technical skills—just a willingness to volunteer for a rotating period of time

\*Altar Guild- usually a monthly rotation—prepare communion, set up the Altar and change the banners for the Church Seasons.

\*Assisting Minister/Communion Assistant—Light the Altar Candles, lead the Psalm reading during the service and provide for the distribution of the wine/juice with the Pastor for communion.

\*Financial Secretary— enter data provided by the Money Counters into the computer program. Verify the entered data with the Money Counters report.

\*Greeters— welcome everyone as they come into church. Introduce yourself to visitors and make them feel welcome. Hand out the bulletins. Indicate attendance on the Membership list.

\*Membership- enter attendance data into the computer program. Send welcome cards to visitors who register with the Greeters.

\*Money Counters- prepare the contribution envelopes, count money and prepare the deposit following worship.

### Church Council News

- Pastor Jim will be attending the Florida Bahamas Synod meeting on June 12th and 13th.
- Vacation time is here—Pastor Jim will be taking a few days off from June 19th through the 22nd. There will not be a discussion time at 9:15am on June 22nd. Further vacation time is not scheduled at this time.
- The Stephen Ministers will be conducting the service on June 22nd.
- Jimmy Driskell fell and injured his right knee several weeks ago. His left knee has been a problem for many years. The issue of having 2 bad knees has been difficult. Jimmy is going to take some Sundays off in June to rest. Linda Carol Poppe has agreed to fill in for Jimmy. Linda Carol was our musician for several years and is looking forward to seeing her old friends again and making new friends too.
- Louise is having Hip Surgery on July 2nd. Volunteers are needed from Monday through Thursday from 9:00 to 11:00 am to open the office. If you would like to take a day or two, please call the office to schedule your time. Answering phones, greeting people and gathering the mail are the duties. Louise will continue to prepare the bulletin and pay bills and can be reached by phone if needed.
- Insurance coverage for our One million dollar facility is \$14,358.38 for the year. Without the wind and hail coverage, it would be \$6,000. The council agreed to insure for wind and hail for the buildings and to move the premium cost from a Thrivent investment to save the 9% interest charges for financing the premium. We will need to put aside about \$1,000 each month to prepare for the premium for 2026-2027. We paid \$1,075 for the monthly premium this past season.

The story behind how Father's Day became a holiday is actually a tale of determination by one woman and a decades-long fight to get fathers the recognition they deserve.

Some attribute the first Father's Day observance to the 1907 Monongah, West Virginia mining disaster that killed 361 men—250 of them fathers— and which left more than a thousand children without a dad. Grace Golden Clayton, whose father was killed in the tragedy, suggested a service of commemoration to the pastor of her local Methodist chapel. But it never really caught on as an annual observance. Two years later, in May of 1909, a woman named Sonora Louise Smart Dodd of Spokane, Washington, heard a Mother's Day sermon by Reverend Dr. Henry Rasmussen in her hometown church and thought a similar day should be set aside to honor fathers. Her own father, William Jackson Smart, a Civil War veteran, raised six children as a single parent.

Father's Day was recognized as a holiday to be celebrated on the third Sunday of June by President Lyndon Johnson's Executive Order in 1966. But it was still not officially recognized as a federal holiday until six years later, in 1972 when, during his re-election campaign, Richard Nixon signed an official proclamation setting Father's Day permanently on the third Sunday in June nationwide.
