Greetings Church!

This month we are continuing our look at the part of the "second half" of the Ten Commandments (VII - X) – those that deal more directly with how we relate to and behave toward one another. The first 'set' was more focused on our relationship with God. Looking at these, we remember Jesus' response when asked about the greatest commandment – and he answered "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment and the second is like it: Love your neighbor as yourself. All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments." (Matt. 22:37-40) If you want to think about this more I would encourage you to read through Jesus' Sermon on the Mount (Matthew chapters 5-7) where Jesus talks about some of the Ten Commandments, and many other things for us to consider and follow.

This year is swiftly passing. Later this month we will be celebrating Thanksgiving. I pray that we all will be thankful all year long as we remember the gracious gifts of God which continue to sustain us. It is wonderful to join together as a country to also acknowledge this on a special day. Worship Scripture Texts for October: The Ten Commandments (continuing the series)

Readings for each Sunday – alternating Exodus 20:1-17 and Deuteronomy 5:6-21

11/2/25 – All Saints/Pentecost 21 – VII. You shall not steal. Deuteronomy 5: 19

11/9/25 – Pentecost 22 – VIII. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. Exodus 20: 16

11/16/25 — Pentecost 23 — **IX.** *You shall not covet your neighbor's house.* Exodus 20:17a

11/23/25 - Christ the King - X. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or male or female slaves, or ox, or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor. Deuteronomy 5:21b

11/30/25 – Advent 1 – *Grounded and Growing – A Shoot from a Stump – A Sign of Hope* Isaiah 11:1-9; Psalm 72:1-7, 12-19; Luke 1:26-38

12/7/25 – Advent 2 - *Grounded and Growing – From Repentance to Growth* Isaiah 27:1-6; Psalm 85; Matthew 3:1-12

Church Council News

- + An estimate has been received for sound system upgrades for the Sanctuary. This is part of the Grant received from the Conference to address sound and lighting for the inside and the patio area. Watch for updates as planning goes forward.
- + Parking lot lighting continues to be a problem. Alternatives to the sodium vapor lighting currently used are being considered. Electrical issues also continue to be a problem in the parking lot area.
- * Repairs to the parking lot and irrigation system are in process. An insurance settlement will fund these projects.
- The Fire Inspection identified the need for 2 fire extinguishers in the storage buildings to be replaced, a electrical box cover on one of the retention pond light poles needed a new cover and Louise needed to update her "Crowd Control Manager" certificate. While it is not required for a church with a seating capacity under 250, it is a good idea. Louise updated her certificate on September 30th. One of the many suggestions of merit is the need for a 'rehearsal' to prepare for an emergency —wind, tornado, fire or intruder— please be aware that clear directions will be given according to the need and the ability of those present. Each person present will be expected to follow those directions to prevent injury, loss of life and for accountability for those present.
- Permission was granted for an Art Group to use the Fellowship Hall for Art Classes. This group will pay a percentage of the fees for the usage to the church. We are anxious to have the church more available to those in the community and look forward to this group on a two times per month basis. There will be no conflict with current usage by Concordia.
