


# The Director's Take

# A Moment with the Manager

Hello to our families, friends and countless supporters! We hope you and your families are healthy and well. I can't begin to tell you how grateful we are for your continued support. Your generosity and thoughtfulness are second to none. Your kindness goes a long way in helping the men at Friendship House to recover. Because of you, we're able to provide a safe, healthy home, which is a huge factor when you are trying to remain sober. As a result, our residents are building a solid foundation in their recoveries. Many of our men are also building a strong relationship with Jesus. Our newer residents, some of them who were not believers, are considering a life with Christ. I continue to encourage them to build and maintain a relationship with Him. We currently have a very solid core group of men who turn their own will over to Him daily. This is evident in their strong participation in group discussions. On Tuesday evenings we are watching the series, The Chosen. This is about the life of Christ and the calling of His initial disciples. We are in season three and then we will be waiting for the intended seasons four through seven to be produced. Season four is scheduled to be out by 2024. We highly recommend this series to anyone interested. We are also working on a weekly Bible study for residents that want to participate. I am confident that our faith based approached will continue to gather momentum, as it is being well received by most residents. In May, we enjoyed LOL, a juggling show put on by middle school students from Windham Christian Academy. Rick Hagerstrom, a professional juggler/illusionist, who also teaches at the school, does a fantastic job putting the shows together and teaching the skills to them. We were also thankful to have two women from Town & Country FCU come and give two presentations to the men in recent months. They covered financial planning, budgeting, understanding and building credit, as well as many other areas, which

has been very helpful to our men. We appreciate them volunteering their time to provide this important information to our men. We received Sea Dogs tickets to opening night, we thank the Portland Sea Dogs and the organizations that have made this possible! I want to take a moment to recognize several of our alumni. Mike D. came by with his sister and brought delicious pulled pork and macaroni and cheese, which she had catered. Our thanks and prayers to Mike and his family. John B. and Patrick F. come by often and we are thankful to see them and how well they are doing. We have been able to bless a few people in the community by moving some furniture lately and we encourage them to call on us if needed.
