Dear Friends,

In my last letter I mentioned that I would be headed to TWR's Cary, NC, office for some additional training in the most effective ways to reach people living in primarily oral cultures. These are people who do not read, or prefer to learn through hearing, or in some cases do not have access to the Bible in their language. That training was originally scheduled for March, but then was postponed to April and now has been postponed again due to one of the trainers having surgery. Please pray for a new date to be set for the training. Pray for me as I also continue to serve as Administrative Assistant to the Director of TWR's Strategic Initiatives & Partnerships department and for the challenges of new ministry opportunities our department faces.

TWR recently launched a new version of its website www.twr.org. If you haven't looked at the website recently, I invite you to check it out. There are many new features including updates on TWR's ministry to war-torn Ukraine and to those who are now refugees. TWR's broadcasts into the area continue to be a source of comfort and provide hope that comes from a relationship with Jesus Christ as Savior. Since the start of the Ukraine crisis, TWR360 www.twr360.org has seen an increase in Ukrainians visiting the site and listening to the programs. Pray for this ministry.

Just one of the projects described on the TWR website is for children in Bolivia who speak the indigenous Quechua language. When Tom and I were involved TWR's Latin America ministry, we visited Bolivia numerous times and saw the need for reaching these young people. The Quechua live primarily in the Andean Highlands or in difficult-to-access forest regions. Over 2 million children in Bolivia speak Quechua. Radio is a key ministry tool, and TWR not only provides programming but gives radios for the Bolivian children to be able to hear those programs. Each episode tells them about God and teaches biblical values and principles in their native language. Please pray for this project and for the Bolivian children who are listening to the programs.
