Little Thanksgivings by Victoria Manuel (using the ESV Translation)

Years ago, I read *The Dragon King Trilogy* for the first time. It's a fantasy series, but the author, Stephen R. Lawhead, is a Christian, and he weaves Christian elements into the very foundations of much of what he writes. During their adventures in the trilogy, the main characters come to know and serve "the Most High God" (very likely an allusion to the honorific "God Most High" in Genesis 14 and Psalm 57). At one point in the series, another follower of the Most High God explains that it is his practice to thank their God for everything, including the little things.

When I first read that, it struck me as a novel idea. I decided to make an effort to do that, too, though I didn't really know why at the time. It just seemed like a good idea. At random points each day, whenever I found myself enjoying something or thinking about how useful or important something was, I thanked God for it. I thanked Him for time to relax, for nice weather, for my comfortable and warm house, for music. I distinctly remember thanking Him once for spoons—such a simple but incredibly useful invention.

It might seem strange to devote prayer to such small things; it did to me at first. Usually people seem to save prayer and thanksgiving for things that are really important to them: people they value, resolved concerns, the success of a major life event, etc. I realized, though, that small-scale thanksgiving had a few very particular effects.

First, it made me think about how much can be traced back to God. The Apostle Paul, in speaking to the people of Athens, calls God "The God who made the world and everything in it" and says He "gives to all mankind life and breath and everything" (Acts 17:24-25). God doesn't exist in only the larger aspects of life, like bountiful harvests and job promotions. He is there in all things. Not even human inventions like spoons could have come into being without Him; He gave us our creativity and our skills and talents. God can be seen anywhere if we only look.

That understanding in turn made me more grateful, more appreciative. Everything we have we owe to God. Everything that occupies our time, everything that makes our lives just a little easier, everything that brings us happiness. He has provided so much for us, and all out of love. As **Psalm 106:1** says, "*Praise the Lord! Oh give thanks to the Lord, for he is good, for his steadfast love endures forever!*" God cares for us immeasurably deeply, and He looks after us in many ways, including making sure we are provided for. Thinking about that always makes me feel warm inside. And it's something we should thank and praise Him for.

I also found that this practice of offering prayers of small-scale thanksgiving made me feel closer to God. All those frequent little conversations made me feel like I was spending more time with Him. Psalm 95:2 suggests this, as well: "Let us come into his presence with thanksgiving; let us make a joyful noise to him with songs of praise!" Praying to God—thanking Him and conversing with Him—draws us into His company. That is one of the most important reasons to pray.

In this busy world of ours, there are so many different things vying for our attention and pulling us away from a prayerful mindset. It can be easy to become so distracted by the to-do lists and deadlines staring us in the face that we forget to stop and think about the God that is ever present but ever invisible. Out of sight can too easily become out of mind. Within the months after reading *The Dragon King Trilogy*, school became busier, and I became preoccupied and fell out of the habit of sending up those frequent little prayers. Lately, I've been feeling my lack of conversations with God, and I happened to look at the trilogy on my bookshelf. I thought immediately of the habit I'd taken up at the wise words of that character, and I decided to make the effort to start again. Then I realized something new. If remembering to talk to God is hard because he is not visibly in front of us, why not make use of what is visible? If we can see Him in all the little things we encounter each day, *they* will be our reminders to think of Him and reach out to Him in thanksgiving and prayer.

During this month of Thanksgiving and after, I hope you'll keep this in mind, as I, too, will endeavor to do. See Him in the little things. Be thankful to Him for the little things. Even if it's something so simple as spoons.

We give thanks for our freedoms


as we pray for those who are oppressed.
