## TRUE JUSTICE AND RIGHTEOUSNESS DEUTERONOMY 17:1–20:20

#### Chapter 17

- A. Laws regarding justice and courts.
  - 1. Religious offenses. (1-5)
    - a. You shall not . . .
    - b. Which has any blemish or defect, for that is an abomination to the LORD your God . . .
    - c. Who has gone and served other gods and worshiped them . . .
  - 2. The Standard of Evidence in Capital Crimes. (6-7)
    - a. Whoever is deserving of death shall be put to death on the testimony of two or three witnesses . . .
    - b. The hands of the witnesses shall be the first against him to put him to death . . .
    - c. And afterward the hands of all the people . . .
  - 3. Provision Made for Higher Courts. (8-13)
    - a. If a matter arises which is too hard for you to judge . . .
    - b. Now the man who acts presumptuously and will not heed the priest . . . that man shall die . . .
- B. Laws Pertaining to Kings.
  - 1. God's Indirect Promise of a Future King for Israel. (14-15)
    - a. I will set a king over me like all the nations that are around me . . .
    - b. I will set a king over me . . .
  - 2. Commands for the King. (16-17)
    - a. He shall not multiply horses for himself . . .
    - b. Neither shall he multiply wives for himself . . .
    - c. Nor shall he greatly multiply silver and gold for himself . . .
    - d. Lest His heart turn away: Each of these issues is a matter of balance . . .
  - 3. The King and the Word of God. (18-20)
    - a. He shall write for himself . . .
    - b. It shall be with him, and he shall read it all the days of his life . . .
    - c. That he may learn to fear the LORD his God and be careful to observe all the words of this law . . .
    - d. That his heart may not be lifted up . . .

#### **CHAPTER 18**

- A. The provision for priests and Levites.
  - 1. The inheritance of the Levites. (1-2)
    - a. The priests, the Levites; all the tribe of Levi; shall have no part nor inheritance with Israel . . .
    - b. They shall eat the offerings of the LORD made by fire, and His portion . . .
  - 2. The specific portions of the sacrificial animal set apart to the Levites. (3-5)
    - a. And this shall be the priest's due from the people, from those who offer a sacrifice . . .
    - b. Your grain and your new wine and your oil and the first of the fleece of your sheep . . .
  - 3. All the Levites had equal rights to the offerings. (6-8)
- B. Prescriptions for prophets.
  - 1. The command to reject all the occult practices of the Canaanites. (9-11)
    - a. You shall not learn . . .
    - b. Anyone who makes his son or his daughter to pass through the fire . . .
    - c. Or one who practices witchcraft . . .
    - d. Or a soothsayer . . .
    - e. Or one who interprets omens . . .
    - f. Or a sorcerer . . .
    - g. Or one who conjures up spells . . .
    - h. Or a medium . . .
    - i. Or a spiritist . . .
    - j. Or one who calls up the dead . . .
  - 2. Why rejection of all these occult actions is commanded. (12-14)
    - a. For all who do these things are an abomination to the LORD . . .
    - b. Because of these abominations the LORD your God drives them out from before you . . .
    - c. You shall be blameless . . .
  - 3. The promise of a true Prophet to come. (15-19)
    - a. The LORD your God will raise up for you a Prophet like me . . .
    - b. From your midst, from your brethren . . .
    - c. Him you shall hear . . .
    - d. According to all you desired of the LORD your God in Horeb . . .
    - e. Will put My words in His mouth . . .
    - f. I will require it of him . . .
    - g. I will raise up for them a Prophet . . .

- 4. The penalty for a false prophet. (20-22)
  - a. But the prophet who presumes to speak a word in My name . . .
  - b. Which I have not commanded him to speak . . .
  - c. Or speaks in the name of other gods . . .
  - d. That prophet shall die . . .
  - e. How shall we know . . .
  - f. If the thing does not happen or come to pass, that is the thing which the LORD has not spoken . . .

#### **CHAPTER 19**

- A. Cities of refuge to be provided.
  - 1. Three special cities. (1-3)
    - a. You shall separate three cities for yourself in the midst of the land . . .
    - b. Prepare roads for yourself . . .
  - 2. The purpose for the cities of refuge. (4-7)
    - a. The case of the manslayer who flees there, that he may live . . .
    - b. Lest the avenger of blood . . .
  - 3. Appointment of additional cities of refuge. (8-10)
    - a. Now if the LORD your God enlarges your territory . . .
    - b. Then you shall add three more cities for yourself . . .
  - 4. What to do with the guilty who seeks protection in the city of refuge: your eye shall not pity him. (11-13)
    - a. But if anyone hates his neighbor, lies in wait for him, rises against him and strikes him mortally . . .
    - b. Deliver him over to the hand of the avenger of blood . . .
    - c. Put away the guilt of innocent blood from Israel, that it may go well with you . . .
  - 5. The cities of refuge as a picture of Jesus.
    - a. The Bible applies this picture of the city of refuge to the believer finding refuge in God on more than one occasion:
    - b. Both Jesus and the cities of refuge are within easy reach of the needy person; they were of no use unless someone could get to the place of refuge.
    - c. Both Jesus and the cities of refuge are open to all, not just the Israelite; no one needs to fear that they would be turned away from their place of refuge in their time of need (Numbers 35:15).
    - d. Both Jesus and the cities of refuge became a place where the one in need would live; you didn't come to a city of refuge in time of need just to look around (Numbers 35:25).

- e. Both Jesus and the cities of refuge are the only alternative for the one in need; without this specific protection, they will be destroyed.
- f. Both Jesus and the cities of refuge provide protection only within their boundaries; to go outside meant death (Numbers 35:26-28).
- g. With both Jesus and the cities of refuge, full freedom comes with the death of the High Priest (Numbers 35:25).
- h. A crucial distinction: The cities of refuge only helped the innocent; the guilty can come to Jesus and find refuge!
- B. Other legal principles.
  - 1. The principle of the landmark. (14)
    - a. You shall not remove your neighbor's landmark . . .
    - b. Which the men of old have set . . .
  - 2. The principle of true and false witness. (15-20)
    - a. One witness shall not rise . . .
    - b. If a false witness rises against any man to testify . . .
    - c. And those who remain shall hear and fear . . .
  - 3. Eye for eye, tooth for tooth. (21)
    - a. Your eye shall not pity . . .
    - b. Life shall be for life, eye for eye . . .
    - c. Eye for eye, tooth for tooth . . .

#### **CHAPTER 20**

- A. The spiritual and practical preparation of the army.
  - 1. The command to trust in God. (1)
    - a. When you go out to battle against your enemies and see horses and chariots and people more numerous than you . . .
    - b. Do not be afraid of them . . .
    - c. For the LORD your God is with you . . .
    - d. Who brought you up from the land of Egypt . . .
  - 2. The command to encourage people before battle. (2-4)
    - a. When you are on the verge of battle . . .
    - b. The LORD your God is He who goes with you, to fight for you against your enemies, to save you . . .
  - 3. How to shrink an army and make it more effective. (5-9)
    - a. What man is there who has built a new house and has not dedicated it . . .
    - b. What man is there who is fearful and fainthearted . . .
    - c. When the officers have finished speaking to the people . . .

    - b. Lest they teach you to do according to their abominations which they have done for their gods . . .
