Evie West speaks from experience as a former L.A. gang member and two-time teen mother who was faced with the decision to terminate her second unborn son. Through God's amazing grace, a story of intrigue, tough love, and miracles, Evie's life is now a passionate picture of redemption and abundant life.

Evie's story comes alive on the pages of her book, "Revolving Choices: Playing Roulette with Life." Each chapter brings to life the adventure and journey of a young, Hispanic girl in a desperate search for identity, but whose life drastically changed when confronted by the power of Jesus Christ. Her story is evidence that God can take your mess and make it your message of love, forgiveness, and restoration.

In 1996, Evie was divinely transplanted to Cleveland, Tennessee where she enrolled at Lee University. In 2001, she graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Intercultural Studies and a minor in Bible. Evie now serves her community as a police officer for the City of Cleveland and works to promote an environment of peace and safety by assisting several organization boards such as Ocoee Regional Multicultural Services, Keep America Beautiful, and Habitat for Humanity.

Because she understands how one comes to the decision to abort a child and what it feels like to give birth and not take her baby home, she speaks with heartfelt compassion on pro-life issues. Adoption as an option is a message she endorses as a volunteer at New Hope Pregnancy Care Center in Cleveland, Tennessee.

Improving Our Efficiency

"Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, making the best use of the time, because the days are evil."

During November and December, we asked for your help to replace our phone system that is starting to show signs of age. The quotes we received put the price for a new phone system and six telephones at \$5000. We also stated that any money raised above this \$5000 level would be used to beginning upgrading computers at the Center. While we have only raised \$3100 of the funds needed for the phone system, God has certainly shown His generosity through you.

First, there is a possibility that we will be able to acquire a new phone system from another business in the area. This system is brand new but did not work out for their needs. It is a system very similar to what we were hoping to purchase. If this business is willing to donate that system to us, Care Net would only need to pay for new phones and a license transfer fee. This will mean the money we already have raised should be enough.

Second, a very generous donor sent a check specifically to upgrade the computers. Over the Christmas holidays we were able to install 6 new computers, have them all networked together, and install a stronger WIFI booster for the back building.

Third, the company that maintains the copier for us called in December with a proposal. Copiers at this time are less expensive than when we leased our current copier. As our lease was almost up on our existing copier, and we were calling regularly for service, they suggested we lease a new copier. With the lower lease and lower cost of the maintenance agreement, we will save money.

All three of these blessings excite us. We feel God is positioning Care Net for growth. Upgraded technology improves our efficiency, meaning we can serve clients more effectively.

Each January, to highlight the work done by area pregnancy resource centers, the Promise FM holds what they call Michigan's Biggest Baby Shower. Fred and Scott from the Promise FM broadcast live from pregnancy centers and encourage listeners to stop by with gifts for the centers.

2019 is the third year in which we have participated in this event. It is always a joy to be so encouraged. We also make sure Fred and the crew have the best weather to travel up from Gaylord. This year it was clear and sunny until the Rudyard



exit. Then it was blowing snow across the highway.

This year, 12 people stopped in. 4 were potential clients and 2 were new partners with Care Net. We received 15 packages/cases of diapers, 5 packages of wipes, 10 containers of Enfamil formula, 11 new baby outfits, 3 baby blankets, 3 bottles of laundry detergent and numerous other items like socks, bottles, safety items and hand sanitizer.

Fetal Development Fun Facts

"Gestation is the period of time between conception and birth when a baby grows and develops inside the mother's womb. Because it's impossible to know exactly when conception occurs, gestational age is measured from the first day of the mother's last menstrual cycle to the current date. It is measured in weeks. This means that during weeks 1 and 2 of pregnancy, a woman is not yet pregnant. This is when her body is preparing for a baby...

Week 5) This is when all the baby's major systems and structures develop...Blood cells, kidney cells, and nerve cells all develop. The embryo grows rapidly, and the baby's external features begin to form. Your baby's brain, spinal cord, and heart begin to develop. Baby's gastrointestinal tract starts to form."

Medical Center Update

"A joyful heart is good medicine, but a crushed spirit dries up the bones." Proverbs 17:2 NIV

God is good all the time. Care Net's medical center continues to see women facing unplanned pregnancies coming for pregnancy tests and ultrasound confirmations of pregnancy. This past year (2018), we performed 21 pregnancy tests and 14 ultrasounds. These numbers are like those of 2017. The difference is that in 2018 9 of these pregnancy test clients were abortion-minded (planning to abort) or abortionvulnerable (influenced to abort). In 2019 we hope to see more women considering abortion and help them to make a choice for life. We are still seeking nurses willing to volunteer a few hours per week to offer pregnancy tests every day we are open. If you would like to volunteer in this way, please contact us. The required training can be started online, then we will also conduct in-house training to orient you to this center.

From Noel's Perspective

Psalm 90:12 ESV

I am sure many of you feel as I do – there are just not enough hours in the day to accomplish all the tasks I have set for myself. Yet, when I sit down and think about how I spend my time, I am disappointed in the quality of the time I spent.

One of my personal "accomplishments" in 2018 was upgrading from a flip phone to a smart phone. I was told how handv they were and how much more productive I would be. I was told soon I wouldn't want to be without it. However, when I look at how I spend my time, I find a lot of the time spent on my phone is with what I call "time suckers": games, social media, apps that don't really serve any purpose but to entertain myself. I am disappointed in how I have let a potentially useful device become a distraction from the purpose of my life.
