It Takes a Village to Raise a Child

"Start children off on the way they should go, and even when they are old they will not turn from it."

Proverbs 22:6 NIV

The mission of the Care Net Pregnancy Center is to affirm the value of life by compassionately presenting Biblical truth to those experiencing pregnancy related crises, along with providing a network of care, resulting in changed lives to the glory of God.

When a woman comes to Care Net with an unplanned pregnancy, one of the main reasons she feels she cannot keep her baby is that she is all alone. How will she provide for the baby? How will she meet the needs of her baby? How will she know how to be a good mother? Many of the men that come to Care Net with the women also have doubts. They aren't ready, they feel unable to provide, they are not sure what the role of a father is.

This is why Care Net offers the *Earn While You Learn* parenting education classes. These classes are designed to help moms and dads see their role in shaping the lives of their littles ones, to provide protection, discipline, love and safety. Many times, these moms and dads lacked these same things growing up. Now they are learning the importance of consistency and perseverance with their own children.

These classes don't just offer conceptual help. Homework assignments allow the parents to practice the skills they learn and measure the results. As the parent is learning skills that give her/him confidence to parent, she/he is also gaining a friend through her/his client advocate. Client advocates help decipher successes and those things that were less successful.

Completing the classes earns points to use in the Mart. These points allow the parents to "buy" clothing, diapers, formula and other necessities for their children. This is different than receiving a hand-out: they are earning these things through the lessons they are taking. Being able to provide for their own children not only boosts confidence, but lets the parents know the community is willing to help. How? All the items in the mart are donated by the community. Care Net lets clients know this. They see generosity first hand.

Care Net also is working to develop relationships with other agencies. This makes us aware of what is available in the area. When we have a client with a specific need, we know where to refer her/him for the best help.

Care Net is working to provide a network of care – throughout the EUP – to help those experiencing pregnancy related crises affirm the value of life to the glory of God.

Being well-trained and knowledgeable is important to serving our community to the best of our ability.

Care Net Pregnancy Center of the EUP strives to send two personnel to the conference every other year. September 3-6, 2019, the conference is in St. Louis,

MO and the theme is "Planning for God's Abundance." We are planning to have our nurse manager attend to gain some of her continuing education credits and connect with other nurses in similar roles. We are also sending our executive director, who is going with several questions for how best to plan for growth.

A Tough Winter Leaves Its Mark

Many folks in the EUP are working through damage from this winter's snow load. Care Net is no exception. The amount of snow caused two problems for the center's back building, which houses the Mart and the medical clinic.

First, as the large amounts of snow melted off the parking lot, the frost line was pushed deeper into the ground. This caused the sewage line from the back building to the street to freeze. Thankfully, this has resolved itself over the course of a month and we can now use water and toilets in the back building.

Second, the trusses of the back building were pressed down under the weight of snow and ice this winter. When the snow melted away, we noticed a break in the mart ceiling. Further investigation showed that 7 trusses are damaged and need repair this summer. The insurance company is working to handle this as quickly as possible.

Before repairs can be made, we will need to pack up and move the items in the mart. Please keep your eyes peeled for a call for help. Many hands will make light work.

Medical Center Update

One of the fun parts of having a medical clinic is interacting with nursing students from LSSU. The senior students participate in 4-hour "internships" with area medical services that are not part of the hospital or doctors' office settings. Care Net is one of those places.

In 2018 we were blessed to interact with 6 nursing interns. This spring we only had 1 student, but we really enjoyed our time with her.

When an intern comes, we share all three aspects of Care Net's

services. Brenda, our nurse, walks through pregnancy testing and what we are looking for in ultrasounds. Deb treats the students to an *Earn While You Learn* lesson and a tour of the Mart. Noel talks with them about reaching out to the community and advertising.

These interactions also help Care Net because we learn what LSSU students are seeking when faced with unplanned pregnancies and how to better interact with them. Page 5 Heartlines

From Noel's Perspective

"So teach us to number our days that we may get a heart of wisdom."

Psalm 90:12 ESV

I am a movie buff. I love all genres and time periods – although I prefer old musicals. I like movies that cheer me up, but I also like movies with strange, unexpected twists. I especially love movies based on true events. *Unplanned* is one of these movies.

Many of you have heard of this movie. So far, I have not been able to go see it. I have seen trailers and read a short article by Abby Johnson herself about the movie. I have also read lots of articles about the effect this movie is having on those working in the abortion industry, how it is challenging their mindsets and changing their perspectives on the services they are performing.

But how does this affect us here in the EUP? We don't have an abortion clinic nearby, so we likely won't see the affects on employees. However, I think we will see more women who have had abortions struggling to cope with the reality that they aborted a real, living baby.

Care Net offers a great postabortion program. It walks a woman through the confession that what she aborted was a baby, but it also walks her through the forgiveness and redemption that can only come from God. He restores and renews.

If you have the chance to see the movie *Unplanned*, be aware that the R rating is warranted due to the graphic nature of abortion. More especially, be aware of those around you as you discuss the movie afterward. How could your words and attitude be condemning or impacting them? How could you be a witness, a shelter, a helping hand? Then consider: could the person you are reaching out to use the post-abortion services Care Net provides?
