When I first tried to write this article I wrote anger. Now I realize I need to write an apology. In light of the scandal in the Church, people have asked me, "are our children safe?" I believed they were and that's what I answered. Now, like you, I'm finding out that wasn't entirely true. I thought certain administrative procedures had been adjusted and replaced so that what happened with Fr. Geoff Drew could not happen. As we have all seen, that was not true. I am sorry that I gave false information. I have been told that since Fr. Drew's removal from office those errors in policy have been corrected.

I think many believed the same things I did. Like me, many of you are angry and feel betrayed. Our trust has been violated again. Having to cope with the misdeeds of wayward priest is bad enough, but in this case, our leadership also failed us. That's a second punch in the guts. They looked the other way; were too busy with other things.

Had these policies I mentioned been in place, would they have stopped Fr. Drew before any harm was done? No. They could have caught him earlier. However, one thing this ugly mess reminds us is that we do not have a foolproof way of stopping pedophiles before they act. Therefore, we will always have to be vigilant for the safety of our children. Thinking, "this could never happen here or to my child" is an open door to these predators.

Another thing this ugly mess makes us aware of is setting up policies to handle all the possible situations is a work in progress and a daunting task. However, that's the task the Bishops of our country have set for themselves and they are caught between the rock of public outrage and the hard place of their own zero tolerance stance. All I can say is, God be with you, gentlemen. I wouldn't want your job.

This brings me to what I've struggled with the most, what to do with my concerns and feelings? First, I want to recommend a book that I found helpful, "A Letter to a Suffering Church," by Bishop Robert Barron. Copies of it are available at the doors of church at no charge. Something Bishop Barron reminds us is that as much as we belong to the Church, the Church belongs to us and there's much in it, like the presence and power of Jesus Christ, that's worth fighting for. I wish I had pages to spend on this topic, because this will mean the most to your faith when it's all said and done.

Next, you may want to express your concerns and feelings to someone. In talking this over with someone, that person asked, will it do any good? I have to believe it will. We must do whatever we can even if it seems a small or token gesture and trust that God will bring it to whatever fruition He sees as worthwhile. So, who do we express our concerns to?
