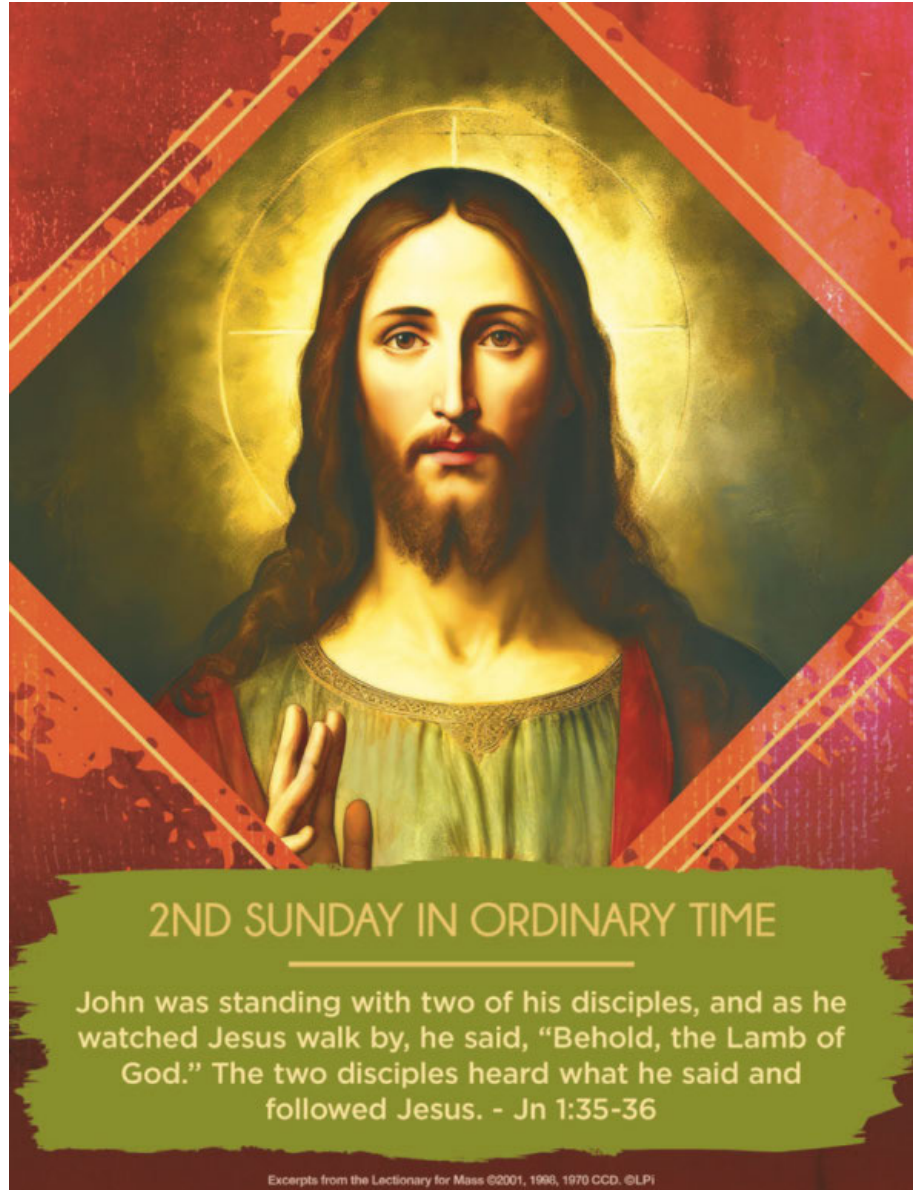

First Reading - 1 Samuel 3:3-10, 19

Today's reading takes place 11 centuries before Christ at an Israelite shrine, which is referred to as a "temple" in the text. At the shrine was the "Ark of God," a wooden chest overlaid by gold in which the 10 Commandments were kept. Eli was the high priest at the shrine. Samuel was a young man in Eli's service. We will hear how God called Samuel to be a prophetic leader in Israel.

Second Reading - 1 Corinthians 6:13-15, 17-20

Today and for the next few Sundays, our second reading will be from the first letter of Paul to the Corinthians. Corinth, a port city in ancient Greece, was noted for its widespread immorality. Anything and everything was thought permissible. Paul doesn't counter this attitude by putting down the human body as evil or of little worth. Rather, he does just the opposite.

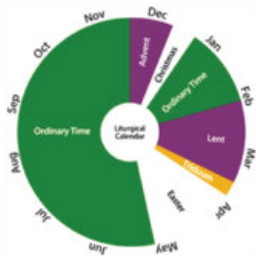

Today is the 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

The color green represents Ordinary Time.

Actually the word "ordinary" does not mean routine but "counted" or "ordinal" time.



Winter Ordinary Time is a bit shorter this year with **Ash Wednesday on February 14th** - when we enter the season of Lent. Summer and Fall Ordinary Time comprise the longest portion of the Liturgical Year, covering as much as six months of the Calendar.

Ordinary Time challenges us with the demands of building the Kingdom. We listen to the Word of God which keeps reminding us of our call as Christians to internalize the teachings of the Lord and to live out what we proclaim. The miracles and the parables of Jesus are, for the most part, the subject of the Gospel readings. The task that we are given is the same task Jesus had - to proclaim the reign of God in our midst - so this is hardly an ordinary mission. The prayers of the Mass ask for the gifts necessary to accomplish this task and they carry the same message: **"Bring forth the Kingdom!"**

Our school community is the foundation on which our core principles of faith and hard work bind us together as a family.

OPEN HOUSE....Our annual open house for prospective families is on January 28, 2024 from noon until 3:00 PM. Those wishing to visit the school and get a tour by one of our staff or board members may RSVP through our website www.stjohn23school.org.

We serve students from age three through grade eight. We offer half-day preschool with a full-day option (until 6 pm). We have before and after school care for our students in grades kindergarten through eight. Students may be dropped off as early as 6:30 AM and picked up as late as 6:00 AM.

Students who need additional support through an IEP or 504 plan can receive this from one of our four intervention specialists, our speech pathologist, and/or our occupational therapist.

Starting in fourth grade, we offer a gifted and talented program for language arts and science. Advanced math courses begin in sixth grade and we are one of the only schools in the Archdiocese that allows students to leave eighth grade having high school credits in both Algebra I and Geometry.

ALL families are eligible for scholarship dollars through the State of Ohio EdChoice programs. The amount the state will provide for each student depends on the number of people in the student's family, as well as the families total yearly income. 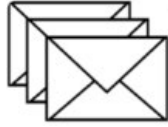
Just a Reminder!

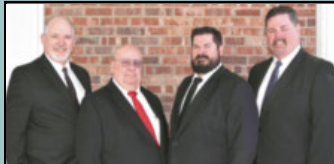
