Rite of Scrutinies use Cycle A Readings while we are currently in Cycle B; therefore the readings for the Masses are different.

Introductions to Readings...by Bishop Ken Untener, in collaboration with Catherine Haven and Fr. Bill Taylor



**First Reading - Exodus 20:1-17....** A covenant is a solemn agreement between two parties in which each promises something. The book of Exodus recounts how the Jews escaped from slavery in Egypt and made a covenant with God on Mount Sinai. The heart of that covenant is this: God promises to accept the Israelites as his people. On their part, they must promise to keep God's commandments.

**Second Reading - 1 Corinthians 1:22-25....** Paul wrote to his Corinthian converts about the difficulty in preaching about a crucified savior: To *Jewish* people who looked for a powerful Messiah performing spectacular signs, it seemed unacceptable that the Messiah would suffer and die. To *Gentiles*, it seemed entirely absurd that someone who died such a humiliating death could be the savior of the world.

#### First Scrutiny Readings

**First Reading - Exodus 17:3-7....** The book of Exodus tells of the Israelites' escape from Egypt and their wanderings in the wilderness. Their trials during that time, the way they faced them <u>and</u> the way God responded, provided future generations with food for thought whenever they faced difficulties.

**Second Reading - Romans 5:1-2,5-8....**In writing to the Romans, Paul is dealing with a community he had not yet visited. Many Roman Christians were converts from Judaism who believed they would be saved by how they lived out the Jewish Law. Paul stresses here, as he does frequently in his writings, that Christians are saved not by the Law, but by faith — faith in what Jesus accomplished by his dying and rising.

### Plant-Based Pad Thai SERVES: 4 PREP: 10 PREP: 30 min. TOTAL: 40 MIN



#### Ingredients:

- 8 Oz Chickpea Linguine or Rice Noodles Tofu (optional)
- 1 14-Ounce Block Extra Firm Tofu (optional)
  2-4 Tbls Soy Sauce, Liquid Aminos, or Tamari
- Veggies
- 1 Small Red Onion, chopped
- 3 Medium Carrots, julienned (roughly)
- 1 Large Crown Broccoli, chopped into small pieces
- 12 Ounces Mushrooms, sliced
- 4 Medium Stalks Celery, chopped
- 1 Red Bell Pepper, thinly sliced
- 1 Large Zucchini, sliced
- 2 Cups Frozen Edamame
- 1/4-1/2 Cup Vegetable Broth, for cooking

Peanut Sauce

- 1/2 Cup Powdered Peanut Butter
- 1/4 Cup Chunky Peanut Butter
- 1/4 Cup Soy Sauce, Liquid Aminos, or Tamari
- 2 Tbls Maple Syrup
- 2 Tbls Apple Cider Vinegar
- 2 Tbls Water
- 1/2 Tsp Ground Ginger
- 1/4 Tsp Cayenne
- Salt, to taste

To Serve

Bean Sprouts, Fresh Cilantro, Peanuts, Scallions, Lime Wedges, Sesame Seeds

**Instructions:** Cook pasta according to the directions. Drain & set aside. If desired, cook the optional tofu. Slice the block of tofu into cubes & cook in a non-stick pan over mediumhigh heat for 5-7 mins, using a few Tbls of soy sauce as cooking liquid. Set aside. Cook the vegetables. In a large skillet, cook the onions over medium heat for 2-3 mins. Add carrots & broccoli & cook 4-6 mins more, until veggies are slightly softened. Add the mushrooms, celery, bell pepper, zucchini, & frozen edamame cook another 4-6 mins until all vegetables are soft. While the veggies & pasta are cooking, whisk the peanut sauce ingredients in a small bowl. Serve the noodles, vegetables, & tofu tossed with the peanut sauce. Garnish with bean sprouts, cilantro, peanuts, scallions, sesame seeds and a drizzle of lime juice, as desired. Enjoy!
