## From the Pastor's Desk

## Live Streaming As a Plan for the Future

In the midst of coming back from the COVID-19 lockdown, there were many decisions that had to be made in order for us to be able to return to having Mass. At that time, your parish staff and I had no good guess as to how many people would return to Mass right away, so we planned to accommodate as many as we possibly could in a safe manner. If close to half of the normal attendance returned, we knew we could not accommodate that many people in the church at either parish. Since we had already begun live streaming Masses at Our Lady of Sorrows, it seemed a natural leap to open up the large halls at the parishes to receive live streams as a way for parishioners to attend Masses while they were happening, receive Communion and still practice social distancing. This became the plan.

When Father Stephen announced his departure new challenges arose. The recent unveiling of *Beacons of Light* has made us all aware that finding a priest that isn't already assigned to Sunday duties is going to become more and more difficult. Immediately I began thinking about things like, what do we do about Christmas and Easter Mass crowds? At least that question already had a solution in the works. Live streaming to the parish halls. While necessary during COVID, in post-COVID times this same technology will allow us to seat about 900 to 1000 at a single Mass at Our Lady of Sorrows and about 800 at Holy Name of Jesus.

Fortunately for Our Lady of Sorrows, we had someone on staff who understands the technology and basics of live streaming enough that implementation of live streaming into the PAC went relatively smoothly. The situation at Holy Name of Jesus has not been so fortunate. We do not have anyone with this skill set on staff. From the beginning, everyone involved has been on a very steep learning curve. We have experienced problems with inadequate internet service, aged wiring and equipment, equipment that didn't work well with other equipment, and the inability of our mature team to troubleshoot issues they were encountering for the first time within a sophisticated set of technology and equipment that they were only becoming familiar with.

"Why can't we just stop using the Parish Hall?" When there are enough open seats in church, that could be done. Using the church basement instead is a bad idea because it isn't handicap accessible and many of the people using the Hall were there because of ease of access. And with only one priest and limited capacity in church, we really need the Hall, especially with the Christmas Masses only days away. Thankfully, the help of a sound tech professional has helped us work out some problems and we've learned the secrets for quick reboots so that recent problems should not be repeated. Does that mean we won't have problems? No, I won't guarantee that. Mechanical things experience glitches, and as I said, none of us are professionals. We will do the best we can and with God's help, we will make it work. But as with all mechanical/electronic things there will be glitches from time to time. And your parish staff will continue to learn and to teach others what they've learned and learn what others know. It's a work in progress at which we will continue to get better.

#### Christmas Masses

Christmas Eve Masses will be at 3 pm at Our Lady of Sorrows and at 5 pm at Holy Name of Jesus. Christmas Day Masses will be at 10 am at both parishes. Masses at Our Lady of Sorrows will be in the church with live streaming to the PAC and via YouTube. Masses at Holy Name of Jesus will be in the church with live streaming to the Parish Hall and remote access with the "Zoom app." (Contact Connie Schenck to access the Zoom meeting.) **We will maintain our safe capacity using our current social-distancing requirements and ask that you wear a mask.**


