

# Advent Reflection

What a week! It seems like everything I touched or looked at has turned into a repair job. The sound system at Holy Name has still been acting up, but hopefully (please, Dear God, let it be so,) it is now fixed. (True, not really my job to fix it, but my worry.) The touch lamp switch on the lamp in the rectory went out. A broken statue needed to be glued. A part needed a bit of solder. And so, it's been. Nothing huge, but just a light bulb here and quick fix there. The rash of little fix-ups got me to thinking, sometimes we look at our life of faith and it's just become a bit shabby and in need of some repairs. COVID and it's many restrictions could be the cause of some of it but the responsibility for putting things back in order falls to you working with God. This Advent is a perfect opportunity for doing some of those needed repair projects. Getting to Confession is a great way to fix a good number of these. Taking more time in prayer is another. But those are general, here's a specific one.

I want to suggest one project that I believe will be very helpful, especially for those feeling lonely or lost this Advent. First, identify a friend or family member who you really need to reconnect with. Write them a letter or send a video message. Take the time to let them know what they have meant to you and how much you miss them. Take the risks of letting them see that they mean something significant to you. Don't be afraid to reach out and bridge whatever distance has grown up between you. The Lord blesses these efforts at mending relationships. May He reward your efforts with a positive response. Next week we will look at a similar journey of reacquaintance, the Visitation.

### **Eucharistic Adoration**

**Eucharistic Adoration is a centuries** old ritual and falls within a broader category of devotions and rituals that are associated with the Sacrament of the Eucharist. Eucharistic Adoration is an extension of the worship and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament that occurs in every Mass. On Tuesday morning after Mass, a one-hour period of **Eucharistic Adoration is held in** Church that ends with "benediction," the blessing of the faithful with the Blessed Sacrament. Although adoration of the Blessed Sacrament can never take the place of Eucharistic Communion, many Catholics find great comfort and consolation in their prayers before the Eucharist when it is exposed in the monstrance during Eucharistic Adoration or in the tabernacle in our Blessed Sacrament Chapel (both are equally valid, as the Christ is not more present in one than in the other). But when we consider our eucharistic devotions, it is always important to remember the fundamental connection these acts of devotion have the celebration of the Eucharist in the Mass and reception of Christ in Communion.

# Everyday Stewardship: Recognizing God in Your Ordinary Moments:

### **Jubilation to Share**

Sometimes you have something to share with people that causes you to well up inside with excitement to the point of going crazy. A pregnancy test, a pay raise, a college acceptance, a wedding or engagement are all examples of moments in life when we might be bursting at the seams to tell somebody the good news. When we finally get the chance to tell somebody, joy just seems to flow through us with ease. We literally want the entire world to share in our jubilation. When was the last time you shared with a friend or loved one how much your faith in Jesus means to you? You don't feel the same motivation to share? Are you not overwhelmed with a desire to spread the Good News? Don't feel bad. You are not alone. As Christians, we often fail to grasp the powerful implications of being a disciple of Jesus Christ. We can become complacent and lose sight of what matters the most. That is when sharing with others about our faith seems uncomfortable. Faith is a gift. As everyday stewards we are called to share with others what God has given us. Advent is a great time to grow in our faith and love of the Lord. The more we cultivate our faith and the closer we draw to Him, the more we will want to share about Him. 
