

All of our Ash Wednesday liturgies include the distribution of ashes. The blessing and distribuis a bit different this year and will takes place in the following way: The priest or deacon will

bless the ashes and sprinkle them with holy water. The Priest or Deacon will address all present and only once say: "Repent, and believe in the Gospel," or "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return," applying it to the assembly. The priest, deacon or lay minister will sprinkle ashes on the head of each person who comes forward without saying anything. The wearing of ashes, while customary and laudable, is not an obligation of the faithful, so anyone who is fearful of becoming sick should not come forward, or even come to a liturgy on Ash Wednesday. Masks must be worn by everyone during the distribution of ashes. Ashes may not be selfimposed: they are always given by a minister.

- On Wednesday, February 17 at Holy Name of Jesus, there will be a Mass at 8:30 am and Liturgy of the Word with distribution of ashes and Holy Communion at 7:00 pm.
- On Wednesday, February 17 at Our Lady of Sorrows, there will be a Liturgy of the Word with distribution of ashes and Holy Communion at 12:15 pm and a Mass at 7:00 pm.

Mass Time Will Not Change for Now

In a very close vote separated by only 5 votes, the OLOS community opted not to change Sunday Mass time. The comments heard during the process confirmed initial expectations. Most would like the Mass times to revert to what they were pre-COVID - that is true at both parishes. There is great sympathy for the needs of our brothers and sisters in our neighboring parish - and this runs in both directions. Once we enter fully into the Beacons of Light process we may be able to find some compromises that serve all our people. And as painful as this transition period is, it is necessary because it causes us to reorient our thinking and priorities from the purely parochial to a greater sense of a Catholic "we" in this part of Butler County. Our next great hurdle is to see what impact *Beacons* of Light will bring to our planning as a pastoral region.

St. Michael's Indian School

Every year donations to our Fish Fry dessert table are donated to a charitable cause. For many years, donations supported a mission in Haiti operated by the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament founded by St. Katherine Drexel. Their support in Haiti has been successful and the sisters have moved on to support other missions. They suggested that we send our donations to St. Michael's Indian School in Lupton Arizona, which has ties to the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament. St. Katherine Drexel established many schools in the western part of the United States, including St. Michael's. It is a pre-K-12 school that serves 364 students and is the only Catholic high school located on an Indian Reservation. St. Mike's provides a Catholic education, upgraded facilities, and technology, and provides faculty and staff with needed housing and competitive benefits - 90% of students receive financial aid. Donations are used for operating expenses, utilities, and classroom updates. Last year, St. Mike's used the monies that were donated to install a new track, continued offering STEM courses in all grades, purchased some new athletic uniforms, updated their textbooks and offered students access to online learning opportunities. Although we are not having fish frys this year or a dessert table, parishioners are asked to consider donating to this worthy cause. You can place your donations in the Gathering Space or the entry way of the PAC. Please make checks payable to OLOS and write St. Mike's in the memo line of your check. During Lent we are called to pray, fast, and give alms. This is a great way to practice almsgiving while supporting the greater need in our Catholic community.


